


# Future's So Bright


The purpose of a yearbook's theme is to look back and emphasize what made this year different. A yearbook is a history book, with a theme that gives the year a title.

The future is bright indeed because of the foundation on which it is built.






# Shortage of Teens in the Job Market



Teenagers in 1980 made up 12.5% of the total work force in Washington state. Not surprising, considering the fast food businesses, and the clerical and sales in the Lacey-Olympia area.

What is surprising is that the number of teens working has decreased in the past nine years. In 1989, only 7.1% of the jobs available in Washington were filled by high school-aged people.

Business leaders predict the serious shortage to continue until the year 2004.

Why aren't teens taking available jobs? Some businesses feel that more teens are relying on their parents to provide for their financial needs. Others are concerned that teens feel that the minimum wage of \$4.25 is not enough. Or do they object to uniforms?

Robert Baker, an economic analyst at the Employment Security Department, State of Washington, has a few ideas of how employers can cope with the shortage of employed teens. The first most important thing for employers to do is raise the wage. Secondly, they can provide more work benefits, including training opportunities.



Some students opt not to work because it interferes with school activities. Others have parents who prefer to see them doing their homework rather than

slinging burgers. Some others just don't want to make the effort.

Familiar words? Most of us recognize the parental advice that we hear each time we leave the house. But what about the family relationship? Is it more than just communicating rules and warnings?

We have often heard about the "changing" American family. The number of single parent families continued to grow. More children entered daycare at an early age. "Many high school students' bedrooms were outfitted with stereos, TV's, and telephones. For some the family sit-down dinner was a thing of the past.

Have the scheduling conflicts, and perhaps the proverbial "not enough hours in the day" eroded the give and take of family communication to a list of rules? How will the '80's lack of communication influence family life of the future?

Our parents and grandparents made and invented things that have caused many different kinds of pollution. What are we, as the next generation, going to do about such problems as:

- \*Acid Rain-Is it ruining our lakes and rivers?
- \*Oil spills- Is it endangering our water life?
- \*Factories-Forest fires-slash burnings-exhaust from cars-Are they endangering the air we breathe?
- \*Pesticides-Sprayed on the food we eat, is it poisoning our bodies?
- \*Noise pollution caused by large trucks and semi's, aircraft, and weaponry-Is it unknowingly damaging our hearing?

For every problem, is there a solution?

Pollution is in some ways being controlled by government restrictions. Factories need to cut down the amount of pollutants they let out into the air. Safer tankers and better transportation are needed to prevent oil spills.

Solid waste is also a big problem. Have you seen all that trash on the side of the road, laying right next to the garbage can? Recycling is a great way to cut down on excess garbage and it also preserves our natural resources. "When people drink out of cans, they could throw them in a recycling bin or anything else recycleable they could put in a recycle bin." Suggested Michelle Carelli.

\*Dawn Easling: "I'd listen to what my family had to say. I wouldn't get mad easy. I would understand that my kids were growing up. Try to communicate without getting into a fight."

\*Meg Norris: "I would understand that kids are not always just like their parents. They should be treated as the unique individual that they are."

"We need to teach each other how to care and that it's okay for friends to care and get them help. This problem won't go away," stated NTHS counselor Brian Wentz. Changing attitudes toward the use of drugs may be the answer to today's serious problems.

Staff and Faculty received inservice training on drugs and alcohol abuse and are more aware of the signs. Students hear the dangers on television, radio, and from parents, teachers, and friends.

"It's a very, very serious problem that is past the point of denial," states Wentz. A tougher, no-nonsense attitude is expected to prevail for years to come, both in school and nationally.



His eagerness to help in any way, from giving a person a handful of encouragement, to a bushel of enthusiasm, made both the staff and the students appreciate his talents and



abilities.




Our futures seem a little brighter when in the caring and understanding hands of the NT staff.


Without the great teachers, secretaries, and advisors the Rams could not have had the sense of pride that each of us felt when we successfully gained the knowledge they willingly offered.

From the extra help after school, to a listening ear, and as far as a true friendship, our staff was always there.




# A YEAR OF MEMORIES...



The cheerstaff represented our student body at community functions, both locally and statewide, showing that our school was "the best." Having great sportsmanship was also part of showing everyone our pride.






## LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION!






# Ski Club Takes The Slopes



# Lending a Helping Hand

Participation adds another dimension to students' vocational training. Club activities emphasize public speaking, parliamentary procedure, and demonstration technique.


Besides leadership, the clubs participate in skills contests for each specific vocational area.

Academic Decathalon is a relatively new sport to Washington State. NTHS competed for the second year, after placing 5th in State last year.


Since Academic Decathalon is new, not all people know how it works. Every year three general areas are picked and any question from those general areas can be asked.


In preparation for tournaments, the team practiced two hours each week.



FFA activities could be divided into categories of Cooperation, Community Service, Leadership, Earnings and Savings, and State and National Activities.



Activities included Operation Senior Citizen, a program of selecting one local senior's home per month and providing pruning or landscape maintenance.





The only requirement for the club was interest and two dollars. Members need not have been in a foreign language to join the fun! *Esther Shaefer*





## Hiking Club Hits The Hills In '90




This year the Hiking Club has hiked to Upper and Lower Lena Lake, Capital Peak, Duckabush on the Peninsula and Mt. Rainier.



Their goals were to be better acquainted with nature and the other members of the club.

Anna Mullic's worst memory was "walking out of the bathroom with toilet paper hanging off my shoe and everyone just laughed. Nobody told me."



When staff members were asked if they thought guide groups worked, they generally thought it was too early to tell.


The big question, though, is how were Guide Groups different from last year's Star Groups. Mixed reactions were heard. Some people believed it was the same idea but allowed for more

time. Others felt its concept was different and the staff got to know and help the students more since it didn't just involve scheduling.



# A DIFFERENT POINT OF VIEW

When I arrived in America, the culture shock I received was very great. In fact I was dumbfounded! There were many differences between American schools and Japanese schools. Even though I had five years of English in the Japanese schools, I could not understand spoken English. Of course, everyone I met was a total stranger. The culture and customs were also very different.

There are many differences between the school systems. In Japan we have no choice of the subjects we must take; here students have many choices.

Our schools' week runs from Monday through Saturday, while here at NTHS classes are Monday through Friday.

In class, American students remark about the subject to the teacher, but Japanese students do not remark. In Japan, we ask the cramming school teacher (a tutor that we go to after our regular studies), a number of students or friends to answer our questions. This shows the different cultural types of study. The Japanese style is passive and the

In America, students move to new classes every period. However, Japanese students stay in the same room and the teachers move from classroom to classroom.



There is one more thing that I find very different.


After school in Japan all students clean up the school. We clean up the school grounds, the bathrooms, in fact, all rooms. Here, students do not do any cleanup.

Dan Coleman, head coach for 6 years, summed up the season. "The team had great potential to be a good team. They worked hard, and it was more rewarding than fun."









This year's volleyball season ended with cheerful laughter and smiling faces. All teams did well, showing great potential and a lot of talent.


# HOOP IT UP!

### Basketball







Another adjustment made was that the number of team members had decreased.


A great deal of time and effort went into each and every track meet by coaches and participants.

Coach Nydam is enthusiastic for next year and encourages all interested persons to join whatever their talent.








# SUCCESS THROUGH GOALS






# Hitting for Home
