





So while looking through this book of memories, remember all the loving, caring friendships that we've made and remember that our time spent at North Thurston was a time well spent as we established those important lasting friendships.





This 1979 annual is dedicated to a man who has made North Thurston High School his second home.




Under the supervision of Jim Slosson, many students have achieved high honors and recognition in various printing related areas.




Even though the season did not go extremely well, next year should be a good season.






The swim team was the most successful team of all the sports at North Thurston, so why don't the students and faculty here make more of an effort to support the team?




History has shown us that any nation that loses sight of where it has been, also loses sight of where it is going.
