




The Social Outlet

At 7:33 the dreadful sound of the first bell rang, as many of your friends departed for class. With luck, you saw them again on your break.


7:38, the final ring! You were doomed to see Mrs. Huizinga if you were late. But cunningly you sneaked into your first period class ... a breeze!









Activities such as games and dances comprised a large part of North Thurston night life. Parties, movies, pizza and homework filled the slack.






Some of the problems that prevented a successful and influential S.A.D.D. club this year were: the lack of an advisor, no designated classroom for meetings, and not enough sponsorship.


Jennifer felt that if they could have more meetings with Chinook, S.A.D.D. would be more successful in the future years.




Coming Home







A Day In Our Lives




The Fire and Safety Committee is a group of seniors who periodically check all classrooms looking for fire hazards.



Governing Our Own




The Scoop Troop




oriented class, encourages leadership and social awareness. It's main goal was to develop future business leaders through competition in different areas of marketing, officer training workshops, and conferences.







Jim Suko and Laura Horan listen to creative ideas during a Natural Helpers meeting.






Dancing Their Hearts Out

The much improved dance team worked hard this year to put on routines at football and basketball games, and at pep assemblies.





In The Pursuit Of Knowledge






Not Just Cows And Pigs Anymore

Getting more active in projects at the local level was FHA's goal this year. The group restructured and students found that the school was wide-open for creativity and originality.




activities and grades.


Suddenly it was November 22 and Induction night had come.

The club grew enormously this year. A great amount of caring was shown on the part of North Thurston. We hoped to do more for people this year because of the larger club and achieved this goal well.



The FLC also sponsored the Sadie Hawkins Dance, a favorite with country folk all around the school.



Rich Evans hated Trigonometry.



"At first I thought all of Ian's friends would make fun of me and give me a bad time but


actually they were really nice," says Kelsey Abel.




Tennis Anyone?



The Rams really came together as a team, both mentally and physically.












Do, Re, Mi . . .





GOING FOR THE GOAL






Goalie Toby Penn makes a quick save to help the team's victory.
