



*Did you need a referee this year? Or a coach? Or a friend? Or did you need a hug? Then you probably looked for Roy.*



*Roy Munroe, the Annual staff dedicates the 1987 Rambler to you in appreciation for sharing your unique and special talents with North Thurston High School.*

According to the Annual's survey this fall, 39% of NTHS students liked rock music with 6% specifying soft rock. Wave captured 13% of the vote followed by the Top 40 with 9% and Heavy Metal at 8%. Receiving 5% or less of the votes

were soul, country, punk, rap, classic and Christian rock.

Rams expressed their musical interests in many ways: their own band, their own instrument, or just listening to their favorite radio station. Survey results indicated that the four top radio stations at NTHS were, in order, KHIT-107, KISW-100, KPLZ-101.5 and KNBQ-97.



# Clashin' Fashions








# Little Red Corvette

The United States has often been described as a Melting Pot, a place where individuals with different backgrounds and interests come together for a common purpose.






## ... And Mr. Price



In 1975 Price assumed the position of Activities Director. Coordinating practices, games, assemblies, and all other school related functions as well as advising the ASB and working with other club and activities advisors, has kept Price extremely busy. "Larry seems to be constantly in motion, completing school related tasks and working with staff and students," observes Jim Koval.




Joe: There are a lot of friends that I hate to leave. Now we're in the



'real world': I know we've got what it takes.

Shannie plans on attending a community college for two years and then will switch to a four year university. Her goal is to become a stewardess on International flights, taking advantage of her ability to speak several languages.







Between meeting deadlines, scheduling interviews, taking pictures, writing copy and captions, the annual staff found time to walk the halls and eat pizza.




# SPEAK NO ENGLISH




This year's Rampage had a new look. With a brand new banner, a new page organization and, most importantly, a huge new staff, it proved to be a very successful newspaper for North Thurston.


# Debate




Once a month the Fire and Safety Committee members inspected the classrooms for possible safety hazards. If any were detected, the classroom teacher was notified and corrected the problem.








# ASB Officers



# Hamming It Up!






# Future Business Leaders Of America




# FFA-Helping The Community



Micky's host was Dee Scaffer. While in Washington she enjoyed playing soccer with the NTHS soccer team. She was also active in Journalism class.







**Robbie:** The new attendance policy is okay because it's designed to keep people in school. It's harder to skip. I know! That's why I have Saturday work tomorrow.




**Clint:** It's okay. It does keep people in class. But I think we should have more passing time between classes because the halls are so crowded.

The annual pizza sale and other fund raisers provided for new uniforms and other expenses.





offer was to teach at an Alaskan Territorial School in the Aleutian Islands. They chose to teach on the isolated island of Sanak, population 75. On August 28, 1951 they set out on the adventure that was to last three years.

Mr. Sinclair learned to hunt wild game for food as well as for sport. On one occasion while hunting Majestic Dall Sheep, he was trapped in a ravine with walls of solid ice. Despite the danger Sinclair refused to part with his trophy animal. He eventually escaped and now proudly displays his trophy.

Another adventurous event was playing the island's lawmaker, preacher, and the islands own John Wayne. Shortly after their arrival, Sinclair found that he was to determine who was the victim and the criminal in a violent suicide and homicide.



*In the future Krista is looking forward to moving to California after graduation. She is interested in coaching gymnastics. Krista thinks that working with whales could be some where in her future as well.*






# Tennis Anyone?



# Swimming




# Cross Country



Unlike softball, the Ram Baseball teams only cut a few people. The Varsity had 15 players, JV had 17, and C squad had 18.



This year's excellent soccer team not only played well but provided fans with hours of outstanding entertainment.



Next was football season and the cheerstaff was encouraged by a very successful pep assembly the first week of school. Homecoming and the rest of the season were also victorious.


Basketball season again was a success. This year is included a twist when the cheerstaff, along with the Dance team, gathered at one house and went Christmas caroling to the players' homes.

# "Stairway To Heaven"




This year Homecoming was a complete success. The theme song for '86, was Led Zeppelin's "Stairway to Heaven."

Friday night's game ended in a 20-12 victory as North Thurston slaughtered Shelton bringing their record to an outstanding 3 wins 2 losses.



