It's no wonder that she was promoted to the district office this year, she really deserved it.





# PEP WEEK






The dance was held in the gym, featuring "Freeway Jam". The Homecoming theme was "Nobody Does It Better".

# SCHOOL BOARD





They also perform some improvised pieces and solos, which are ones without notes.



# STAGE BAND

The band plays at all the home football and basketball games, and this year, the symphonic band played at a Sonics game.


As far as competition goes, the band takes part in two major band festivals.

With the experience and know how of the conductor, Mr. Turner, the band has made tremendous improvement, and will no doubt make more improvements in the future.










# DRAMA

The advisors were Bill Basset and Bill Compton. The officers were Mark Randal, Ann Skaarup, Angela Dimico and Mariana Smith.





Losing no varsity players and having a strong junior varsity team we are looking foward next year toward an undefeated season and a possible first place.








This years Boy's Varsity Basketball team finished its regular season with a 16-4 record; the finest record compiled by the team in the last twelve years.

The Rams will be losing 7 seniors that have been very instrumental to the success of the team both offensively and defensively.





Statistically the Rams outscored their opponents 37 to 24. Defense was the best part of their game, but the offense improved greatly at the end of the season. Good job Rams!










# PHYSICAL ED

The Ski School got a new advisor this year, known as the Blonde Bomber, alias Barb Bonnell. She is taking over the advisorship from Mary Sparling.






Above : 1977-78 Flag Raising Committee



The student leadership headed up all the committees, and basically forms their structure and goals.




Girls league is one of the most outgoing clubs sponsored by the school. Meetings are held once a month for all the girls of the school, to inform them on the many events slated.

## FUTURE BUSINESS LEADERS OF AMERICA




The members also went on a field trip to a concert on foreign music.
