




On November 22, 1963, North Thurston's busy schedule slowed from its normal pace to mourn with the rest of the nation, the death of President John F. Kennedy.








#### Counselors




#### Director of Special Service




#### Athletic Director

Heading the athletic program of North Thurston District this year was George Rowswell. Among Mr. Rowswell's many responsibilities was supervising the physical fitness program.



#### Cooks






One year in running, the members of the North Thurston High School Art Club have been successful in their attempts to further students' interests in the field of art.

The club also enjoyed films on the proper techniques of skiing, and as a club they subscribed to a magazine about skiing.





# MARATHON






## GYMNASTICS


Peninsula and were quite important in handing the Fife Trojans one of their two league losses.


## OUR GOAL: TO STUDY AND TO LEARN


## AND SPRING AWAKENINGS . . .


The band performed for many functions. They added to the enthusiasm at the pep assemblies and marched at the football games.


