


In Which Our Beloved Student Body Appears

This year the mixed chorus provided entertainment for various benefits and city organizations — thus adding to their already busy schedule.


Money-raising projects under the direction of the band have included a nut sale in December and candy sales in the spring. All profits from these sales have gone toward the purchasing of new band uniforms.

All three organizations are directed by Mr. Duxbury. Much credit goes to him for the contributions he has made to the Music Department.




The field events include such competition as pole vault, high jump, broad jump, shot-put and discus. Field and track events demand speed, form and strength.






North Thurston's tumbling team concentrates upon developing elementary tumbling stunts into a routine. The trampoline and springboard are also used in performances.

Thirty boys made up the tumbling squad for this year. The members are students who develop exceptional ability in the art of gymnastics.


