



EMOTIONS . . . This word expresses an idea which is a very important part of our high school years. These eight letters encompass everything we ever feel.



The 1963 *Rambler* staff has tried, in this book, to set up a record of the year, and in doing so, set up a record of some of the emotions felt by you, the students.








His concern and willingness to help a student with his problems of school or family, and his friendliness towards all are only a few of the characteristics which make Dan Nasman one of North Thurston's most respected and well-liked counselors.

Counselors are professional teachers who have obtained training to help students to live more effective lives. They handle student problems, schedule classes and recommend changes in student schedules. They administer aptitude and personality tests, prepare test profiles, and counsel with students about the results. They enter scores of tests on permanent records, go over college and vocational plans with students, and figure grade point averages for scholarships. With relation to graduate follow-up work, they keep records of the number of former students in college, service, married, or working, and survey problems and records of graduates. Last, but not least, they conduct research in high school programs.

In February the Sophomores sponsored a dance which was, to their pleasure, a successful one.




Under the supervision of Susan Daniels, Drillmaster, the Drill Team performed many nights at both football and basketball halftimes.





WORK BRINGS WELCOME VICTORY




What does more to make half-time at a basketball game more lively than a tumbling exhibition? One feels a chill when a tumbling team moves gracefully through its stunts.
