


Where are You Going?


Look at the future

And destined for sorrow?



And the effort you've made.











Abera had attended a combination of church schools and nationally supported schools in Ethiopia. Six years prior to coming to the United States, he had been taught entirely in English. Abera was graduated from Woizero Scheen Secondary School in 1964.




Abera played an important role in the success of his school. In 1960, 1961, 1962, and 1963, he belonged to the Sports Club and was a member of the Debating Society. In 1962, he was the president of Science Club and English Editor for the Newspaper Club. Abera was the literacy campaign treasurer in 1962-63. He was a member of the Student's Council in 1961-62, Secretary in 1962-63, and President in 1963-64.


The things which impressed Abera most about America were its friendliness, the people's interest in others, our education system. He did not think he would ever like American food. He enjoyed television immensely and he was very interested in the Civil Rights problem. He disliked our music, especially the classical.

His aspirations were to take electrical engineering at the University of Washington, to teach in his own country, and to improve the educational system in Ethiopia. These were fine ideals for any man, and we, the students of North Thurston High School, wish you the best of luck in all that you may do, Abera.

The first presentation consisted of four one-act plays: "You too can be Charming", "An Over-praised Season", "The Lottery", and "The Last Word".


The club sponsored a donut sale, participated in the one-act play festival at P.L.U. by staging the "Queens of France".




This year the members of the North Thurston Chapter of F.H.A. chose as their objective—Launching Good Citizenship through Homemaking.

The 64-65 season was a year of building for the swim team; as it would be for any first year sport. The swimmers worked hard to form the nucleus for a swim team in the years to come.



All in all, the Junior Varsity had a fine season. During the course of the season, several of the Junior Rams were able to fulfill their ambitions by moving up to the Varsity.





In their first game the Rams traveled to Curtis to face the Vikings. Boasting a sizeable lead in the early part of the contest, the Rams fell back in the third stanza. Fighting to regain the lead the Rams ran out of time, losing a close game 58-57. The next night, the Rams hosted the highly touted Olympic Bears. As in their first game, the Rams held an early lead, but again fell back losing 63-55.

Heading into a rough schedule which includes such highly rated teams as Clover Park as well as the teams in their own league, the team worked hard in pre-season work-outs to have a successful season.



