

In school, at home, and any place you choose to be, music surrounds you.


To us, music represents many different things; friendship, love, happiness, anger, success, rejection, and countless other things.




The Madrigal group was composed of 11 singers. They performed for various private groups in the South West Ensemble Contest in Centralia, and the Spring concert.





CHRISTMAS PAGEANT



Tumbling
