

NURSES ASSISTANTS




The project of the band in the following years is to obtain uniforms. Duane M. Duxbury directed the group.





The purpose of GAA is to promote good fellowship and better sportsmanship among girls who enjoy athletics. Miss Margurite Hayden was the advisor.




