



**Course Overview**

This Spanish I course aims to introduce students to the Spanish language and its diverse cultures, fostering communication skills and cultural understanding. **Time Frame**

15 days



**Focus of the Unit**

This unit introduces the benefits and strategies for learning Spanish, focusing on the Spanish alphabet, pronunciation rules, and identifying cognates. Students will also locate Spanish-speaking countries and research their products and perspectives. Learning Spanish is considered an important aspect of a global education.

**Unit Title**

Conversational Elements & Noun Foundations

**Time Frame**

15 days



**Focus of the Unit**

This unit focuses on foundational vocabulary for basic conversations, including days, months, seasons, and counting 0-100. Students will learn to carry on basic conversations about personal information, dates, time, and weather. Key grammar points include identifying gender and number of nouns, definite and indefinite articles, and their use with adjectives.

**Unit Title**

Verbs (Ser) & Sentence Construction

**Time Frame**

15 days



**Focus of the Unit**

This unit introduces infinitive verbs, subject pronouns, and sentence structure. Students will recall infinitive verbs and learn to use the verb "ser" in all forms to describe people, things, and relationships. It also covers the use of subject pronouns and comparing English to Spanish sentence structure.

### Focus of the Unit

This unit focuses on -AR verbs, teaching students to construct sentences using them. It emphasizes distinguishing between infinitive and conjugated verbs and includes discussion of class schedules

### Focus of the Unit

This unit focuses on practical communication for daily life, teaching students to order food and express opinions on food, healthy eating, and lifestyle habits. The core is the construction of sentences using -ER and -IR verbs in these contexts.

### Focus of the Unit

This final unit introduces basic stem-changing verbs to enhance conversation. Students will learn to describe family relationships and make plans for parties or family gatherings. A key cultural component is identifying various holidays and customs in Spanish-speaking countries, such as Día de los Muertos, La Navidad, and El Cinco de Mayo.
