

Course Title

IAA Visual Arts Major Advanced Level I - Drawing/Painting I: Full Year



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Course Overview

Drawing and Painting 1 is a beginner level visual arts class designed for students who are choosing to further study art after their 7th and 8th grade rotation. The course is designed to provide students with the foundations of artistic expression and new media. Students will learn how to manipulate the design elements and principles of art, as well as use a variety of drawing and painting media to communicate ideas creatively. Drawing and Painting 1 will provide students with the foundation skills needed to further study and practice art, upon a passing grade and teacher recommendation to higher level art classes.
