Task	How do I complete this task?
Attend an information session	Ask your school's CCP Coordinator for dates
Complete and submit Letter of Intent by April 1st	Letter of intent can be obtained through your school counselor or the CPS CCP website.
Gather your Social Security Number	<p>The online application will require this info.</p> <p><i>Note: Students without a social security number are still eligible to participate. Most colleges offer an "other" option under citizenship questions.</i></p>
Apply on college website to their CCP Program	If you need help, ask your school counselor.
<p>Ensure you're eligible to participate</p> <hr/> <p>Additional Materials:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Parent/guardian approval of mature content. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ This is provided by the college and must have a parent/guardian signature. ● Student questionnaire on social readiness for college. 	<p>Meet 1 of the following requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● <u>Option 1</u>: Student is in grades 7-12 and has at least a 3.0 unweighted GPA ● <u>Option 2</u>: Student is in grades 7-12 and has a 2.75-2.99 unweighted GPA & a "B" or better in relevant coursework (i.e. "B" In 2 years of High School English to take English at the college level) ● <u>Option 3</u>: Student is in grades 7-12 and has a college-ready test score, which could include one of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ ACT: English Score of 18, Reading Score of 22, or Math Score of 22 ○ Additional test options: SAT and Accuplacer
Enroll in CCP courses	<p><u>In-high school CCP courses</u>: schedule with school counselor</p> <p><u>On-campus and online CCP courses</u>: schedule with college academic advisor</p>
