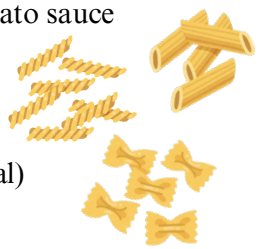


Recipe of the Month: Vegetable Pasta

Ingredients:

- 1 box of Rigatoni (or any pasta of your choice)
- 8oz of spinach
- 2 eggplants (sliced or diced)
- 1 tomato (optional)
- Ground chicken (1lb)
- 1 jar of your favorite tomato sauce
- 1-3 clove(s) of garlic
- Half an onion (diced)
- Cilantro (chopped)
- 1 green onion (chopped)
- butternut squash (optional)
- Vegetable / olive oil
- 20 mushrooms (optional)



How to make:

Boil pasta in pot for however long it says on the box (time varies depending on what type of pasta you chose. In a pan add 2 tbs of oil of choice, heat the pan until the oil is bubbling and add in ground chicken, slowly chop / mix the chicken with a wooden spatula until chicken is golden brown.

Mince your clove(s) of garlic, chop / slice / dice your spinach, eggplants, onion, cilantro, green onion, mushrooms, butternut squash and tomato and add it to your ground chicken. Overtop of your ground chicken vegetable mixture add one jar of tomato sauce and let it simmer until the sauce starts bubbling (if there is no room in the pan move your mixture to either a larger pan or a small pot).

Strain your now done pasta (keep your pasta al dente if possible) and put the chicken vegetable and sauce mixture over the pasta. Plate, Share and Enjoy.

Newspaper Club Poll: Does Pineapple Belong On Pizza?



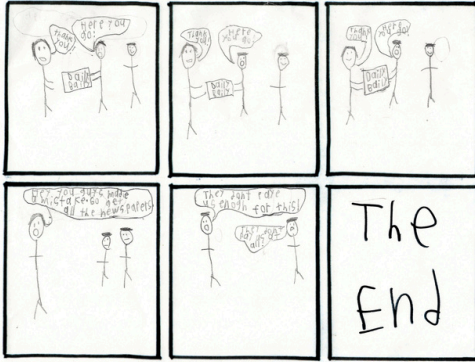

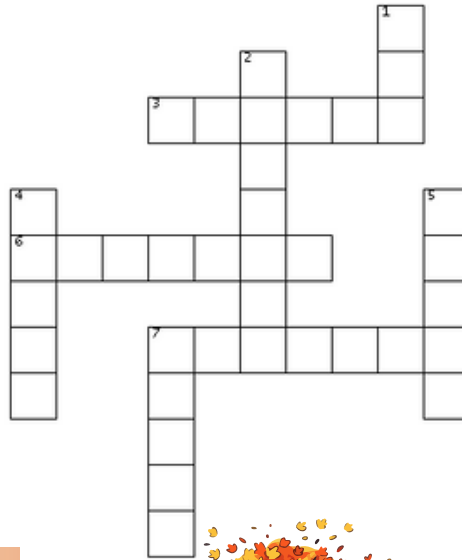
