

NYSDOH REGISTERED  
OPIOID OVERDOSE PREVENTION PROGRAM

I. Statement of Policy

- A. The Waterville Central School District (the District) shall maintain an Opioid Overdose Prevention Program (the Program) registered by the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH), pursuant to the provisions of Public Health Law Section 3309. An opioid antagonist shall be maintained on site in each instructional facility to ensure emergency access for any student or school personnel having opioid overdose symptoms, whether or not that person has a previous history of opioid abuse.
- B. The use of opioid antagonists by the District shall be included in the District emergency response procedures for health emergencies.
- C. The District employees are permitted to volunteer to be trained and to function as Trained Overdose Responders (TORs). Volunteers will be provided training in accordance with New York State law and regulations. The District will train staff annually. Kits for the intra-nasal administration of opioid antagonist are available at each AED location – High School Fitness Center, ice room (mobile) and exterior door from the gym to the soccer field.
- D. Opioid antagonists shall be maintained in specific locations to ensure emergency access for any student, staff, or community member who is suspected of having opioid overdose symptoms, whether or not that person has a previous history of opioid abuse.

II. Program Oversight

The Board authorizes the Superintendent to designate a Program Director and a Clinical Director for the Program.

III. Implementation

The Superintendent or their designee shall promulgate any additional regulations and procedures as required in order to implement this Policy and maintain an Opioid Overdose Prevention Program consistent with the NYSDOH and the NYSED.
