

## STUDENT AUTOMOBILE USE

### I. Student Vehicles

A. Student driving is a privilege which is granted to students who obey the rules and show mature judgment in using vehicles. Students who intend to drive vehicles to school must follow these rules:

1. Students are responsible for the safety of pedestrians at all times.
2. All vehicles must be registered with the main office.
3. All parking is to be done in the designated parking area.
4. Students are not to sit in their car at any time during the school day.
5. Cars are not to leave the school campus until the close of school without permission being granted by the principal.
6. All unlicensed vehicles, including snowmobiles, mini-bikes, dirt bikes, and ATV's are prohibited on school premises.
7. Students are not to take their personal automobiles to either BOCES class or other school buildings within the district without permission being granted by the high school administration. At no time are students authorized to transport other students.
8. Students are prohibited from parking in any area which might impede the flow of traffic.

II. Students found in violation of any of the above stated rules are subject to the following penalties:

- A. 1st offense - loss of driving privilege for two weeks.
- B. 2nd offense - loss of driving privilege for four weeks.
- C. 3rd offense - loss of driving privilege for one year.

III. Students operating an automobile that constitutes a safety threat to themselves or other students, or causes vandalism to school property, will have driving privileges suspending for one calendar year.
