

SCC Academic Action: Definition of SCC terminology and corresponding outcomes at JCEC

If a student is not making Appropriate Academic Progress, there are 3 levels of Academic Action as defined in SCC’s Academic Progress Policy (6.02.04)” Warning, Probation, and Suspension. This applies to all degree, diploma, and certificate seeking students at SCC.

<p><u>Appropriate Academic Progress:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Students maintaining a GPA of 2.0 or higher in consecutive semesters - Student shows satisfactory class attendance and engagement in online course work 	<p><u>Appropriate Academic Progress:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Student input helps guide course choices where possible - Students earn grade level appropriate flexibility and freedoms at JCEC - JCEC pays for all required SCC course materials (with few exceptions)
<p><u>Academic Warning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - performing below a 2.0 grade point average in the previous semester - Students on academic warning will work with their advisor to develop an academic plan and/or will be directed into specialized coursework. <p><i>Warning does NOT appear on transcript</i></p>	<p><u>SCC Academic Warning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Student will meet with their JCEC advisor - Advisor will contact parent and review Academic Progression policies - JCEC advisor/administration may adjust the student’s schedule and/or add additional seminar blocks to support student success - JCEC will not pay for books/materials for any class that must be retaken
<p><u>Academic Probation:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - have not attained a 2.0 grade point average for the two most recently enrolled terms within the past three years - required to review and modify their academic plans with their advisor. - may be required to limit their semester course load <p><i>“Probation” notation appears on transcript</i></p>	<p><u>SCC Academic Probation:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Student and parent will meet with the JCEC Academic Advisor - Schedule revision as needed per advisor or administrative direction - Course options for student may be limited - Full or partial textbook and course materials cost responsibility may shift to student and student’s family
<p><u>Academic Suspension:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - previously on Academic Probation - have not attained a 2.0 grade point average for the three most recently enrolled terms within the last three years and - have a cumulative GPA below 2.0 will be suspended for one semester. <p><i>“Suspension” notation appears on transcript</i></p>	<p><u>SCC Academic Suspension:</u></p> <p>In addition to all items listed above:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Student schedule may be modified to include only JCEC classes (one-time option when possible and with administrative approval) - Student may become ineligible to remain a JCEC student due to inability to take SCC courses

Any affected students will be notified by SCC. Suspended students, if registered for the following semester, are automatically dropped from those courses. Suspended students will be eligible to re-enroll for the next semester.

JCEC students wishing to appeal must contact Allison Hawkins, Academic Advisor at JCEC before the start of the upcoming semester to begin the SCC appeal process.
