



★ **ISIP Reading Scores** - 4th and 5th are using IXL to Benchmark students for the fall and will use their diagnostic scores to watch progress.

No changes in Math as it wasn't tested.



Math | Grades K - 5


Levels National norms

Percentile ranks





Percentile ranks

Noticings: This 2nd test was the Flex Diagnostic Results and has 43 more students take the test after the October report and we gained about 14% of students above the national average in 2nd -5th grade.

★ IXL Reading (2nd - 5th)



Noticings: This is our Flex diagnostic screener for reading and it shows that 62% of our students are above the average. I am confused by the results from the month before because it is showing about 18 less students above the national average and I didn't think we tested a second time. I will try to figure this out for the next report.

★ Behavioral/PBIS Updates -

We are still working on how to bring Classroom 180 material back into play for the spring semester, as we only gave an overview of Trauma informed teaching. We are working with PBISapps.org and Katie Conley from BSU to bring a tracking system of behavior called SWIS. This will help in providing data and graphs of where challenges are and how to work on changing the challenge areas. Greg is still currently working with Nicole Thomas, Special Education Director and Craig Woods, Superintendent and the other elementary principals on how we could provide a place for students who aren't quite ready for a full classroom environment. Some districts have more resources and we have looked at some of those programs but we need to work towards one for Emmett as the other elementary schools have students with similar needs. Parents don't always have the tools to work with their children to get them ready for school and need our collective support and resources to help provide training for them and their to be students as well. We should have more to share with the new board members in January.

★ Staff Highlight Certified/Classified

Vanessa Ghiglione is our School psych, and I am thankful that she is helping us in refining our intervention practices to bridge the gaps that students have in skills with the right interventions. She wants to help us make sure that we aren't missing something for every child.

Valerie Padgett, Title I para, is noted for her special ears that she wears daily and how she greets all the students by name. She is going to be taking on more of a data role so that we can analyze where our students are quickly and making sure the data is imputed and ready for future tracking. We have hired Georgeann Tippy to step into some of the small group roles that Valerie will have to step aside from for the data work. We have also added Brooke Deneke to our special education staff after losing a couple to other places in the district earlier this school year.

★ Events Past/Upcoming

Wagon's Ho and Trunk or Treat on the same day was challenging but I am glad that we were able to get Wagon's Ho back to Carberry after many years. Below are some pictures of the fun day.
