Parent Compact

The Wishram High and Elementary School created a parent compact to enhance student academic outcomes. This compact describes the school, teacher, parent, and student responsibilities to support student academics. The goal for the compact is to strengthen partnerships between schools and parents. The compact demonstrates our dedication to involving families in their children's education and empowering our school to implement effective family engagement strategies that align with the school's academic goals.

January: Screeners

Wishram High and Elementary School screens our students a few times a year, including at the beginning of fall, winter, and spring. The purpose of these screeners is to give insight to teachers about how their students are performing academically. From this, teachers can identify what skills and components that teachers will need to focus on, along with teaching strategies to implement to best support our students. Additionally, screeners help to identify students who may benefit from intervention support. This year we used EasyCBM grades K-8 and MAPS for grades K-12.

Cycle 2 ends on January 9th and cycle 3 interventions will continue on February 2nd. They will be 6 week cycles to provide additional literacy skills supports for students K-12. Parents are notified via a take home letter when their student is entered into reading intervention. Information includes the duration of their intervention, how often they come during the week, and curriculum. If you have any questions about your student in intervention, please feel free to contact Mrs. Monica Snodgrass.

Tips and suggestions for reading!

1. Set goals to improve vocabulary, understand the text more, or connect the story to your own life.
2. Incorporate questions for students to make predictions.
3. Encourage a routine for students to read each day for a set time such as reading for 20 minutes a day.
4. Praise your students for their effort and success! Praising can help build their confidence in becoming great readers.

Multilingual Families

Your input is valuable to us! We are dedicated to improving our support for multilingual students and creating an inclusive and supportive educational environment for all our students at **Wishram High and Elementary School**.

This year we received a Title VI Grant through the Office of Indian Education. With this grant, we are able to offer Native American Language classes to all of our students. This Language Class fits into our District's Strategic Plan. **Classes will begin in October and will continue through May every Wednesday for 30 minutes, except for the late start Wednesday's there will be no language classes.** The K-1, 2-3, and 4-5 classes will be during non-core class periods. The 6-8 and 9-12 will be optional to the students and taught during non-core class periods. The instructors will be Colleen George and Katherine George and they will be working with David Barthlow. We are very excited to be offering this opportunity to our students.

Citizen Complaint Process

We encourage parents and public schools to work together to resolve concerns or disagreements about a school's program or a student's education. There are steps that must be followed before you file a complaint with OSPI.

2. If you are not satisfied with the outcome of your local complaint process, and you believe that the law that applies to federal programs like Title I, Part A has been violated, you have the right to file a complaint with OSPI. Parent's Right to Request Teacher and Paraeducator Qualifications

All parents and guardians have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's classroom teacher(s). If you request this information, the district or school will provide you with the following as soon as possible.

1. If the teacher has met state licensing requirements for the grade level and subject in which the teacher is providing instruction.
2. If the teacher is teaching under an emergency status for which state licensing requirements have been waived.
3. The type of college degree major of the teacher and the field of discipline for any graduate degree or certificate.
4. If your child is receiving Title I services from paraprofessionals, and if so, whether those paraprofessionals meet state/federal requirements of the Every Student Succeeds Act.
