It's hard to believe that we're already talking about the next school year. **ALL K-12 families will use EnrollJeffco to indicate where their student(s) will be attending school for the next school year.** You will use [EnrollJeffco](#) whether your student(s) is re-enrolling at the same school, changing schools, or just starting in Jeffco.

The K-12 enrollment window for Round One is open until **Friday, January 9** for the 2026-27 school year. **Please be sure to complete your enrollment for next year by January 9th.**

- For current 6th and 7th graders, you will be directed to either confirm your ongoing enrollment at Deer Creek or submit an application to enroll at a different school.
- For current 8th graders, you will either confirm you will be attending your neighborhood high school or submit an application to enroll at a different high school.



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## From the Dean

Hello Mountaineers Families:

While we are in a new calendar year, we continue with our expectations begun in August. There is a lot that will happen during the next five months inside and outside the classroom, and we appreciate your continued partnership and support with guiding students to positive decision-making.

When you have conversations with your student, I encourage you to help your student with reflecting on perspectives, awareness of the impact they have on others and others on them, and how difficult situations can be handled while still being respectful and kind. We all make mistakes, so helping your student understand the importance of, and how to take responsibility for their actions, repair harm, and moving forward with a lesson are important things to discuss as well.

If you would like support with any of these discussion topics with your student, please reach out.

Here are some reminders:

**Take care of Chromebooks!** Under no circumstances should a student hit, punch, kick, throw or pull apart a Chromebook, whether their own or someone else's. The Chromebooks are provided to students to use, and we are seeing significant issues with students believing they are not responsible for the proper care of the device. Please talk with your student about how taking care of their Chromebook as they would their phone or personal device. Fines do happen with intentional destruction or misuse resulting in damage or destruction.

**Students are required to have their student ID at lunch.** A new ID can be purchased in the main office for \$5. Please ensure that your student has their ID every day. The number of students without IDs is impacting the ability to get students through the lunch line efficiently. Please talk to your student about being responsible at lunchtime.

# Mental Health Update

Got the January Blues?

Blue Monday, the third Monday of January, has earned a reputation as the year's toughest emotional day. It is widely associated with low moods, depleted motivation, and the inevitable post-holiday slump. Although the concept was initially created for promotional purposes, it has successfully evolved into an annual cultural touchstone. It serves as an important reminder that mental health deserves attention, especially during mid-winter when factors like short daylight hours, cold weather, and financial stress can significantly impact emotional wellbeing. This time can also highlight the pressure of negative New Year's resolutions; instead, the focus should be on creating supportive goals that prioritize kindness and self-compassion.

While the notion that a single day is objectively the "saddest" lacks clinical basis, Blue Monday is now utilized by organizations and communities to drive awareness and support. It has become a valuable opportunity to promote self-care, reduce the stigma around emotional struggles, and encourage open dialogue about mental health. Falling on January 19th in 2026, the day prompts people to check in with themselves and others, acknowledging that emotional lows are a real part of the human experience and require empathy and support.

Rather than completing simulated classroom projects, students design, prototype, test, and refine solutions to problems faced by the aerospace industry today.

**Real-World Learning:** Students apply science, technology, engineering, math, and problem-solving skills to meaningful, real-life challenges. This increases engagement and helps students understand how classroom learning connects to future careers.

**Career Exploration:** By working on NASA-aligned projects, students gain early exposure to careers in engineering, manufacturing, robotics, design, and space exploration—fields that are growing and in high demand.

**Collaboration and Communication:** Students collaborate in teams, communicate ideas clearly, manage timelines, and respond to feedback from industry professionals—essential skills for success in any career path.

**Equity and Access:** NASA HUNCH is designed to inspire all students, including those who may not yet see themselves as “engineers” or “scientists,” by providing hands-on experiences that build confidence, creativity, and perseverance.

**Pride and Purpose:** Students take ownership of their work, knowing it has the potential to contribute to real NASA operations. This sense of purpose fosters motivation, resilience, and school pride. Individuals can even put that they were contracted by NASA on a resume!

By bringing the NASA HUNCH program to our middle school, we are giving students an early opportunity to think critically, innovate boldly, and see themselves as capable problem-solvers who can make a difference in the world.


