7. SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

- CSBA conference may have provided information regarding the state budget and how Governor Newsom expected to release the proposed budget on January 10.
- Current state revenue is coming in higher than expected in the short term. However, projections show that the increase is not expected to continue in future years.
- For K–12 education, this may result in receiving one-time funding, such as block grants. The District must carefully avoid using these funds for ongoing costs, including salaries.
- The state’s fiscal outlook may mirror the 2008–2012 period, with the potential for categorical funding and stricter spending requirements.
- California continues to experience a decline in population, which is affecting the state’s tax base. At the same time, tax revenues from AI-related growth and higher-than-expected stock



market returns may impact future funding, and the implications for K–12 education will need to be closely monitored.

- Emphasized the Board’s responsibility to set the policy and vision for the District and noted that, as negotiations move forward, the priority remains meeting student needs through the best possible programs while valuing and appreciating all staff and employees.
