Ready, Set, Read! 2026 Frequently Asked Questions

About *Ready, Set, Read!* (RSR)

1. *How do I know if RSR is appropriate for my child?*
 - RSR is a reading program for students rising into Kindergarten through 5th grade (for the 2026-2027 school year) who struggle with the reading process, are falling below grade-level expectations in reading or writing, or have been diagnosed with dyslexia.

2. *If my child is an appropriate candidate for the program, what does the registration process entail?*
 - **StG students:** Email the coordinator, Sarah Duplantier, at ReadySetRead@stgnola.org for next steps.
 - **Non-StG students:** Email the coordinator, Sarah Duplantier, at ReadySetRead@stgnola.org.
 - **Beginning February 11th**, you will be prompted to complete a Google Form survey called Interest Form for RSR! 2026.
 - If your child has a current evaluation, parents will be asked to share current evaluations electronically and have their child's learning specialist, tutor, reading teacher, or support person complete a Google document called Confidential Teacher Recommendations. The coordinator will share this document directly with the support person who will be completing it. **If the Confidential Teacher Recommendations form is not completed or the coordinator requires more information regarding your child's learning profile, you will need to sign up for a screening (see below).*
 - If your child does not have a current evaluation, they will need to come to St. George's to meet with an examiner for an hour for a screening. There is a screening fee of \$90 that is accepted at the time of the screening. The coordinator will share a SignUpGenius link with you to reserve a screening date and time.
 - If a student is determined to be an appropriate match for RSR, the coordinator will send you a link and instructions for online registration (see below).

3. *If my child is an appropriate candidate for the program, can or should my child attend both June and July sessions?*
 - Typically, students attend one session; however, a child can attend both sessions if appropriate.

4. *When will I receive my registration link?*
 - First, the coordinator has to determine if your child is an appropriate match for RSR through the screening process or teacher feedback forms. Then, if an appropriate grouping is available to support your child's needs, they will send you a link and instructions for online registration. A small group of three well-matched peers must be confirmed before a link can be shared.

5. *How do I pay for RSR?*

- Once the registration link is shared by the coordinator, you will register on the Active Network portal, and you will be prompted to enter payment information. Registration links are active for one week only.

More About Screenings

6. *Who is required to complete a screening?*

- Non-StG students who do not have a current evaluation and those for whom the coordinator requires more information regarding their learning profile are screened.

7. *When do you offer screenings?*

- **Screenings will begin on February 23rd.** We are only able to screen on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays from 3 - 4 p.m.

8. *What is the screening process like for non-StG students?*

- Your child will come to St. George's and meet with an instructor for an hour. There is a screening fee of \$90 that is accepted at the time of the screening. After the screening, you will obtain an overview of the results, as well as recommendations for skills that could be targeted over the summer.

9. *What type of information will I gather about my child's learning profile through the screening?*

- The examiner will assess early literacy skills and reading proficiency on a timed fluency measure, sound/symbol identification, decoding and encoding skills, and phonological awareness skills. Based on your child's results, the screener will provide recommendations for skills to target.

10. *What happens if my child is screened for RSR and there isn't an appropriate grouping for my child?*

- Parents will receive the screening report that outlines an overview of the results and recommendations for skills to target. In addition to the report, the coordinator will provide other recommendations that may include providing a list of individualized tutoring support services, at-home activities, or other recommendations for the next steps that best support the child's learning needs. The screening fee is non-refundable.

RSR and Dragon Camp (DC)

11. *Can my child attend both RSR and DC?*

- Children who are entering kindergarten, first, second, third, and fourth grades are welcome to participate in both RSR and Dragon Camp. We strongly encourage families to sign up for the first RSR class from 8 - 9:30 a.m. if their child is planning to attend Dragon Camp.

12. *What will my child miss at DC if enrolled in RSR?*

- The coordinators of RSR and Dragon Camp will make every attempt to limit dual registrants from missing fun activities when finalizing the schedule for the summer.

13. *Is there a discount for attending both RSR and Dragon Camp?*

- There is a \$100 discount that will be applied to your Dragon Camp payment if your child is registered for both RSR and Dragon Camp.

14. Will RSR and DC work together to get my child to and from both programs?

- If your child is enrolled in Dragon Camp, we will get him or her safely to and from their classrooms each morning.

Communications

15. How will I receive updates on my child's progress throughout the session?

- You will receive two progress reports containing the targeted skills your child worked on throughout the session. The reports will also highlight how your child is performing with each targeted skill (beginning, progressing, mastery).
