Chemistry Students Explore STEM Day at CCC







From Classroom to Greenhouse



Our *Comprehensive Agriculture* students have recently transitioned from animal science to plant science as we prepare for hands-on learning in our brand new greenhouse. These students will take on the role of greenhouse managers, learning the ins and outs of greenhouse operations, including plant care, organization, and day-to-day management. Through these lessons, students are developing a deeper understanding of what it takes to successfully run a greenhouse while creating a working list of supplies and materials needed for the growing season ahead.


This greenhouse will serve as a long-term, hands-on learning project used across most of our agriculture classes, allowing students at multiple levels to gain real-world experience, build leadership skills, and connect classroom instruction to practical applications throughout the year.



Global Challenges, Student Perspectives

Prior to Christmas break, our *Environmental Science students* explored a variety of global environmental issues through a student-driven research project. Instead of a traditional assessment, students selected a global environmental topic to research and present to the class. Before break, students shared their presentations, giving peers the opportunity to learn about a wide range of environmental challenges from one another.

Each project examined the issue itself, what is causing it, potential solutions, and why understanding these challenges matters both now and for the future. Topics included soil degradation, food waste, loss of biodiversity, deforestation, and fossil fuel dependency. This project encouraged critical thinking, collaboration, and a deeper awareness of how global environmental issues impact our world.




