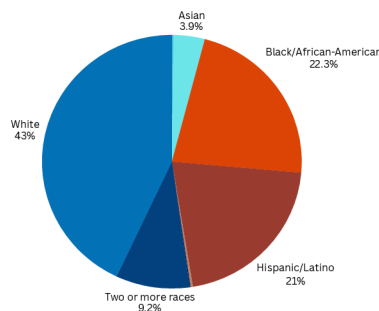

Pathway to Honors

Honors-level credit can be earned in 160 courses, in all curricular areas except Physical and Wellness Education. Honors credit is recognized at the end of the semester based on the quality of student work. Honors credit is not offered in the summer.

College Credit

Students may dual enroll in both an ETHS class and the equivalent Oakton College or Lake Forest College course to receive college credit. Dual credit is currently offered in certain courses in the Arts, Career & Technical Education, Mathematics & Computer Science, Science, and World Language departments. In addition, students who have exhausted all of the available accelerated courses in an academic area at ETHS may take courses at Northwestern University. College courses appear on transcripts as Pass/Fail.

Career Pathways and Certifications

ETHS offers a wide range of career and technical education programs, including 6 Project Lead the Way (PLTW) engineering courses and several industry-recognized certifications (Automotive Service Excellence, Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA), Early Childhood Education, food service, metalworking, Pharmacy Technician).

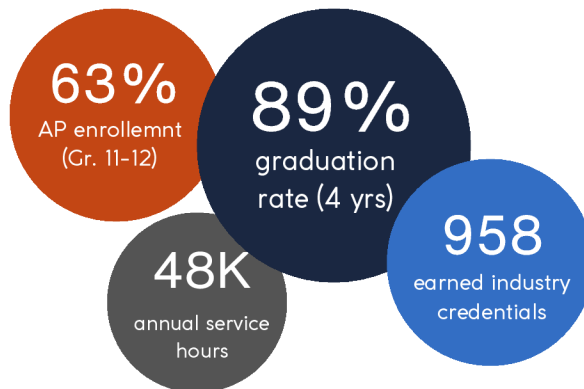
