Sailor Bucks may not be REAL money, but they are very close to it! The *Sailor Store Program* is part of the Lakeview Middle-High School's Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS) program. It involves school staff "catching" students following the Sailor Code:

- **Students being here on time and ready to learn**
- **Students being respectful to others**
- **Students acting in safe ways**
- **Students demonstrating a positive attitude and positive behavior**

If a student demonstrates any behaviors related to the Sailor Code, staff members can award them with *Sailor Bucks*. Students will then be given opportunities to cash in their *Sailor Bucks* for prizes from the *Sailor Store*. These prizes may include footballs, basketballs, hair clips, games, water bottles, hats, ear rings, art supplies, cafeteria coupons, and many other options. This is a great way to recognize students for their efforts in creating a safe, kind, and positive school culture and to encourage others to contribute.
