Customer issues/ resolutions

This month, the weather caused some problems. In the last few days of school in December, some bus routes had flooded roads. We called a few families and asked them to bring their children to a spot where the bus could pick them up safely.

Near Scio, the bus couldn't reach the usual turnaround point. However, parents were able to drive their cars to meet the bus, so we contacted them and requested them to bring the students out.

Bus 1 in the Talbot area was rerouted to avoid flooded areas. All students were able to be picked up at their normal stops with the detour. Route 3 was also changed to avoid flooding on Jefferson Marion Road at Skelton.

Early in the morning, I drove roads for a couple of hours checking the routes because of the high-water warnings. We were prepared, and everything ran smoothly.

Successes of the Month

- The 12 routes in December ran well without incident.



Technology Updates

- **First View District Dashboard and Parent Tracking App**- now active and we have 57 parent users, and 98 students belonging to the 57 parents.
- **Driver Hub Training** – Driver turn-by-turn directions and onboard job aid.



Routing updates

- Both Trillium schools ended their services for the 2 Jefferson students over the holiday break. When school starts back up again, in January, we will have 2 less routes bringing our route count to 10.



Latest news

- The drivers enjoyed breakfast with Cori, before school ended and she left for TX. Cori will be starting to drive for First Student in Amarillo, TX on January 6, 2026. We wish her the BEST!
- We have several trainees working on getting their CDL Permit and hopefully soon we will have people to train. In the meantime, starting in January, we will have a borrowed driver from Portland, for which we are Thankful.

Superintendent Update – January 2026

School Board Recognition

The month of January is School Board Recognition Month. I want to take this opportunity to thank each and every one of our board members for your dedication to the Jefferson School District. Most people don't see the late-night meetings, the stacks of reports you read, or the tough decisions you make to ensure our students have the best possible experience. Being a board member is not a paid position nor is it your day job. You volunteer your time and your "why" is clear in every action you take: you care about our kids. Thank you for being the champions our students need, and we are profoundly grateful for your service.

PERS Update

I wanted to provide the Board with an update regarding PERS rates and the changes that the district needs to plan for going forward. As you know, our PERS rates increased significantly for the 2025-27 biennium. This is going to happen again for the 2027-29 biennium as well because our PERS bond will be going away at the end of December 2027. For the 2027-29 biennium, I am anticipating a 14.85% increase in rates for Tier I/II employees and a 18.03% increase in rates for OPSRP employees. I am hearing that the 2029-2031 biennium rate increases may be worse. As we begin preparing for the 2026-27 budget, I will be working on a plan to help mitigate the impact that these increases will have on our budget.

Enrollment

While the district has remained pretty consistent with enrollment, we are still down 15 students from what we budgeted for this school year. We have also had some increased costs in areas that we were not anticipating and will need to plan for those going forward. I will be working with building administrators and department directors to address budget issues as we begin planning for the 2026-27 budget. We did make a few cuts last year and decreased overall supply budgets by 25%, and I anticipate having to tighten our belts more for the upcoming year.

Inclement Weather

January and February are typically the months in which school districts must address inclement weather and make those difficult decisions regarding weather delays and/or closures. I have already provided staff and families with the inclement weather plan for the district so that we are prepared for any days where school may need to be delayed or cancelled.

School and District Report Cards

I have included in your packet copies of the individual school and the district level report cards for the 2024-25 school year. These reports are published each year for all Oregon schools and districts as required by the Oregon State legislature and the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). These reports were designed by and for parents and community members to be an understandable and easy to read overview of how schools and districts serve their students. Jefferson School District is responsible for ensuring that the At-A-Glance profiles reach the parents of children enrolled in our district by January 15 of each year. We will be notifying parents via Parent Square that these reports are available and will provide them with a link to the state website where the reports can be accessed.

Family and Student Connections

- December Highlights** December was a month of celebration and connection at Jefferson Elementary School. JES students proudly represented our school by singing at the town tree-lighting ceremony and at the State Capitol. Kindergarten students delighted families with an afternoon performance, while fourth and fifth grade students presented a musical for the school community and families. JES also hosted a Winter Read-Aloud and Sing-Along with strong family participation. These events supported our PAX/PBIS and character education goals by promoting teamwork, confidence, and a sense of belonging.
- Community Service & Student Leadership** Brenda Rushing and David Lake, along with our Super PAX student leaders, organized a schoolwide food drive for JES students and families. Together, our school community donated over 600 pounds of food to the Jefferson Food Bank, more than doubling last year's total. This initiative reinforced our PAX/PBIS focus on kindness, teamwork, and civic responsibility, while providing students with authentic opportunities to practice leadership and service to others.
- Character Education & School Culture** The month of December focused on the character trait of *Humility*, while January's focus is *Integrity*. JES kicked off each month with a PAX assembly highlighting the featured trait through discussion and song. In addition, we introduced a "Minute to Win It" activity to build community, cooperation, and JES school spirit.

Community Connections

- PAX Leaders** Are a group of students who consistently meet expectations and go above and beyond in service to our school community. They can be found organizing playground clean ups, supporting younger students during lunch, and contributing ideas to improve school climate. To honor these students, David Lake recruited a retired teacher who now volunteers her time, along with her spouse, to design and coordinate a monthly celebration activity. Together, they generously donate both time and materials, fostering pride, gratitude, and continued leadership among our PAX Leaders.

- **SMART (Start Making A Reader Today) Program**
The SMART program continues to be a strong success at JES and supports our early literacy priorities. Volunteers from a variety of backgrounds work alongside staff to provide targeted reading support for our youngest learners, including all kindergarten classrooms, an increasing number of first-grade students, and our Life Skills classroom. This additional, consistent reading time strengthens foundational literacy skills, increases student engagement, and fosters a positive relationship with reading, directly aligning with our school and district early literacy goals.

- **The Parent Teacher Organization (PTO)** continues to be an important partner in supporting students, staff, and schoolwide initiatives at Jefferson Elementary School. Recent contributions include:
 - **Family Engagement:** Hosted a safe and fun Glow Dance event that brought families together for an evening of dancing, community, and camaraderie.
 - **Community Support:** Partnered with staff to provide 34 food bags to student families over Winter Break.
 - **Arts & School Events:** Created the backdrop and decorations for the JES musical production, *Christmas at the OK Corral*.
 - **Staff Appreciation:** Provided holiday appreciation and a generous supply of coffee pods for staff.
 - **School Climate & Spirit:** Provided a JES t-shirt for every student and staff member, creating a sense of unity. Fridays are now JES Spirit Days, with our school community proudly wearing our new colors.

Programs & Professional Learning

- **Building Thinking Classrooms in Mathematics**
JES staff remain committed to continuous improvement in mathematics instruction. A core group of teachers has committed to the *Building Thinking Classrooms in Mathematics* framework and is supporting colleagues as staff collectively explore this instructional practice. Teachers continue to meet regularly to collaborate and reflect, and the team is exploring opportunities to visit Oregon City schools where *Building Thinking Classrooms in Mathematics* has been successfully implemented.

- **Literacy Focus – Rural Schools Cohort**
Jefferson Elementary School continues to participate in an Early Literacy Education–focused cohort. Through our partnership with Stand for Children Oregon and Willamette ESD, JES has received onsite instructional and systems coaching to evaluate and strengthen our literacy program, with the goal of improving student reading outcomes.

JES was also awarded a small Oregon Department of Education grant to support High-Dosage Tutoring for students in grades 3–4. Participation in ODE’s High-Dosage Tutoring Community of Practice provides additional professional learning, and these funds will directly support targeted literacy instruction for students.

JHS Updates

- Attendance
 - Our goal for the entire building is regular attendance (over 90%). Last month, we had 144 students who met that goal.
 - Our regular attender rate has dropped a bit over the past couple of months, but we have about 6% more regular attenders than we did this time last year.
 - The attendance team meets weekly to discuss students and supports. We also share individual students' attendance data with Pride teachers so they can check in with students and families.
 - We have monthly attendance check-ins in Pride and celebrations to reward regular attenders.
- Alternative Pathways Program
 - 13 students in our hybrid model
 - 15 students in our fully online model
 - 3 students graduating at semester
- 9GOT - 9th grade on track team
 - Meet weekly to discuss student progress and supports. This is our second year of the team.
 - ODE Report Card for last year shows that 88% last year's ninth grade students are on track to graduate. We almost met our school goal of 90%. The previous year we had 76% of our ninth grade students on track.

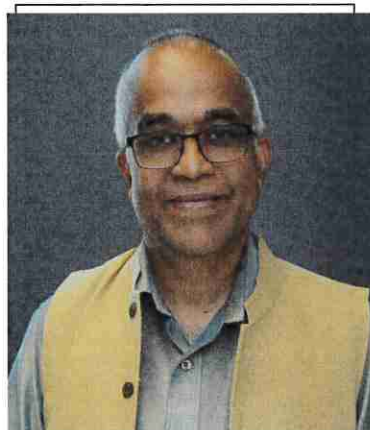

1. Need accurate costing and adequate public school funding, review and revise the 30 years old archaic funding model, a new costing study that emphasis adequacy and equity, and tied to academic outcomes and optimal class size. 2.
