


MAHWAH PUBLIC SCHOOLS BOND REFERENDUM VOTE TUESDAY, MARCH 10



THE FUTURE OF OUR FACILITIES AND OUR COMMUNITY

QUESTION 1 Critical Infrastructure & Efficiency Upgrades to All Buildings to Maintain Core Operations, Security and Efficiency

- **Upgrade** leaky roofing and inefficient HVAC systems that are more than 20 years old
- **Convert** locker room/storage area into designated space to build a life skills program for 18-to-21 year old students with special needs
- **Replace** select windows and doors that are original to the building to enhance security
- **Complete** exterior brickwork to preserve our beloved buildings
- **Replace** aging, end-of-life boilers


QUESTION 2* Create Consistency Among Elementary Schools, Improve the T-Bird & Community Experience

- **Build** new, designated gym at Betsy Ross and George Washington Elementary Schools to ease crowding, create more safe and functional space and create space for community organizations
- **Upgrade** grass fields at the High School and Ramapo Ridge with turf and lighting to create reliable field space for students and community recreation programs
- **Replace** media center, currently housed in a trailer, and add a music room at Betsy Ross
- **Build** a new, second gym with bleachers on both sides at the High School to replace small, 1950s layout that is not comparable to neighboring districts and to improve scheduling and access for students and community recreation programs
- **Renovate** the High School auditorium, entrance and lobby - including the original 1950s seating

**Question 2 can only pass if Question 1 is also approved.*

Leaking roofs, like this one over the MHS kitchen serving line, cause water damage and compromise facility integrity. Replacement roofs would protect school assets.





BY THE NUMBERS

IF VOTERS APPROVE QUESTION 1

\$75.8M in improvements

— **\$25.1M** state aid

= **\$26** per month

IF VOTERS APPROVE QUESTION 2*

\$62.6M in improvements

— **\$3M** state aid

= *additional* **\$31** per month

**Question 2 can only pass if Question 1 is also approved.*

The estimated tax increase is based on the Mahwah Township average assessed home of \$481,238. Remember assessed value is different than market value!



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
