THE SCHOLARSHIP INTERVIEW

The following scholarship committees will be conducting personal interviews: Ziegler Family Foundation Fund, Rolfs Educational Foundation, Froedtert West Bend Hospital Foundation, COLUMNS, Froedtert West Bend Partners, the Froedtert West Bend Partners Volunteer Program, the Mauland Cross Country Scholar Athlete, and the Optimist Club – Fran Wajer Memorial Scholarships. The first five committees will interview together so you will be meeting with as many as 8-10 people at the time of your interview; the last four scholarship committees will select the students to be interviewed and interview information will be sent out to just those students. All interview committees choose their recipients.

We realize that many applicants are more effective than others in an interview situation because they are able to talk freely about their accomplishments, service to school and community, and plans for the future. The following guidelines may help you:

- Think about the message you send by the way you dress
- Be prepared to “sell yourself”
- Maintain eye contact
- Discuss any honors or awards you have won
- Expect to expand on information you have on your application.
- Use proper English (i.e., yes instead of ya, tons of things or stuff (be specific), umm’s, received instead of have gotten, etc.).
- Use humor when appropriate
- Be ready to elaborate on your career goals
- Practice answering questions with your parents or friends
- Be prepared to discuss:
 - What you have done to prepare for your future (courses, jobs, volunteer work, etc.)
 - The estimated cost of your education
 - How you plan to meet those expenses
 - Any experiences you have had which relate to your chosen career

Be sure to thank the committee for their time at the end of your interview.

Students are reminded NOT to make vacation or college visit plans the week of March 13, as these are the only days that scholarship committees will be interviewing. If you are not in school these days, you will not be part of the interview process for scholarships.

Read this Guide very carefully, fill out the checklist, and go to the West Bend District website to begin completing your applications. Your checklist will determine the number of applications you need to complete and make copies of. Do not fill out the checklist if you have questions. Questions specific to your academic record should be directed to your counselor; general questions about scholarships listed in the Guide should be directed to Mrs. Pauli. Because not all scholarship committees interview, it is important that you fill the application out neatly and accurately. Remember, the completed applications AND the checklist are due to Mrs. Pauli by February 10, 2023.

December 5, 2022 **SCHOLARSHIP KICK OFF NIGHT** – This meeting for seniors and their parents/guardians starts at 7:00 PM in the high schools’ Auditorium, the Silver Lining Art Center.

February 10, 2023 **COMPLETED APPLICATIONS AND THE CHECKLIST DUE** – Applications AND your checklist are to be turned in to Mrs. Pauli. (Refer to the document, “Scholarship Submission”)

March 13 - 17, 2023 **SCHOLARSHIP INTERVIEWS** – The Ziegler Family Foundation Fund, the Rolfs Educational Foundation, the Froedtert West Bend Hospital Foundation, and COLUMNS interview teams will interview on these days. Specific information regarding your interview date and time will be sent to you around March 1st. You are responsible for checking on your interview date with Mrs. Pauli in the College and Career Center if you do not receive a letter. Early graduates are especially reminded to check your interview date and time by calling Mrs. Pauli at 262-306-4637.

March 2023 **OTHER INTERVIEWS** – Students who apply for the Froedtert West Bend Partners, the Froedtert West Bend Partners Volunteer, the Mauland Cross Country Scholar Athlete and the Optimist Club – Fran Wajer Memorial Scholarships will also be interviewed. Representatives of these scholarships will select the students they wish to interview. If you are selected to interview, you will be notified of the date, time and place. These interviews typically take place the week before the other interviews.

April 2023 **SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS NOTIFIED**

May 1, 2023 **SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS PROGRAM** – Scholarship recipients will be honored on Monday, May 1, 2023 at 7:00 PM, in the high schools’ auditorium, the Silver Lining Art Center. Family and friends are invited to attend.

Local scholarships provided by industries, organizations, and individuals are not restricted to students pursuing four-year college programs. Many scholarships are open to students who plan to enroll in technical programs (business, cosmetology, nursing, auto mechanics, x-ray technology, etc.). Some scholarship programs have restrictions regarding rank in class; some stress financial need as one of the major criteria. Grades in special interest areas are important! Applicants for technical scholarships are urged to submit a letter of recommendation from a teacher in his/her major area. Usually, a local scholarship will not be awarded to a person who has received another substantial scholarship. Be sure to include all information asked for by the scholarship organization (letters of recommendation, essays, etc.).

Scholarship recipients are selected by the organizations offering the scholarship, **not** by any high school staff member. The high schools provide the information the committees ask for to aid them in making a decision (i.e., grade point averages, test scores, etc.).

Each scholarship is designated **Technical, Academic, or Technical or Academic.**

ACADEMIC Students who are planning to pursue a four-year (Bachelor's Degree) college program are eligible.

TECHNICAL Students who are planning to pursue a program that is up to two years in length are eligible. All programs qualify whether they are offered at technical colleges, business schools, beauty schools, hospital schools of nursing, etc.

THINGS TO REMEMBER

1. Applicants be sure to include a letter of recommendation, **if and only if**, requested by the scholarship organization.
2. Technical applicants are encouraged to submit a letter of recommendation from a teacher who can speak to your intended educational goal.
3. Be sure to include an essay if requested by the scholarship organization.
4. Staple a copy of your Volunteer Service Program Report to each of your completed applications. All volunteer hours submitted to the College and Career Center by Monday, January 20 will be listed on your report. Make a request for an official Volunteer Report no later than Thursday, February 1 so you can staple it to all your applications.
5. Applications AND the checklists are to be turned in to Mrs. Pauli in the College and Career Center by February 10.
6. Staple a copy of your transcript, ACT report and Volunteer Service Program Report to each of your applications.
7. Interview dates are March 13 - 17, 2023.
8. Students will be informed of their interview date and time sometime around March 1st. If you do not receive a letter, it is your responsibility to see Mrs. Pauli in the College and Career Center or email anpauli@wbsd-schools.org to check on your interview date.
9. Staple a copy of your transcript, ACT report and Volunteer Service Program Report to each of your applications.
10. Early graduates are also responsible for checking on the interview dates and times by calling Mrs. Pauli at 262.306.4637.

ZIEGLER FAMILY FOUNDATION FUND**ACADEMIC**

Eligibility: Upper 5% of class and must have attended at least their last two years of high school at the West Bend High Schools.

Five scholarships are offered in the amount of \$7,500 per year. One scholarship each at East and West High School, and three are awarded at large, either high school. The awards are for one year, renewable for the duration of a 4-year (8 semester maximum) college course of study leading to an undergraduate degree if objectives and nondiscriminatory renewal criteria are maintained. The primary basis for the awards should be the qualities of leadership the candidate has shown in school and/or the community. If a family has a Ziegler scholar in an undergraduate program, a sibling is not be eligible for the Ziegler Scholarship.

ROLFS EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION**ACADEMIC**

Eligibility: Upper 15% of the class, demonstrate need, and attendance at a 4 year institution.

The ROLFS EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION will be awarding two (2) scholarships each year. The scholarship is \$7000 a year, renewable for the duration of a four-year college program, providing the recipient's grades and conduct are satisfactory to the scholarship committee.

FROEDTERT WEST BEND HOSPITAL FOUNDATION**ACADEMIC**

Eligibility: Upper 10% of class and must have attended at least their last two years of high school at the West Bend High Schools.

The Froedtert West Bend Hospital Foundation will award two (2) \$6,250 scholarships. One scholarship will be offered to an East graduate and one to a West graduate. This scholarship is offered for one year and will be renewable for four (4) years provided grades, progress towards degree fulfillment, and conduct satisfactory to the Scholarship Fund Committee are maintained. Leadership abilities and school and community service, and activities are also considered. The college or university selected must be recognized by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools or other correspondingly appropriate body.

FROEDTERT WEST BEND PARTNERS**ACADEMIC**

Eligibility: 3.75 GPA; pursuing a degree in health-related field.

Two \$7,500 scholarships will be offered to seniors of West Bend East, West Bend West, Kewaskum, Slinger, Living Word or Kettle Moraine High Schools who maintained a 3.75 grade point average during high school and who will be pursuing a degree in a health-related field. The student must continue to pursue this major. A minimum ACT score of 27 is required. The initial grant of \$1,875 per student per year will be renewable for four years upon presentation of a transcript showing acceptable grades at the end of each semester. Family must be a resident of Washington County. In the event of a large number of applicants, a preliminary screening will be done and interviews granted accordingly. Minimum requirements subject to change at the discretion of the Partners Volunteer Scholarship Committee.

FROEDTERT WESTBEND PARTNERS VOLUNTEEN

ACADEMIC

Eligibility: 3.5 GPA; 100 volunteer hours at hospital; pursuing a medical field of study

One \$2,000 scholarship will be offered to a senior of West Bend East, West Bend West, Kewaskum, Slinger, Living Word or Kettle Moraine Lutheran High Schools who maintain a 3.5 grade point average during high school and who will be pursuing a medical field of study post-high school graduation. A teen volunteer must have 100 cumulative hours volunteering at St. Joseph’s Hospital and have been a Volunteer for a minimum of two (2) consecutive years. Students will be considered eligible if they have a minimum 25 ACT score and a strong concentration within the math and science curriculums. Family must be a Washington County resident. Minimum requirements subject to change at the discretion of the Partners Volunteer Scholarship Committee.

WEST BEND CHILDREN’S THEATRE, INC.

ACADEMIC OR TECHNICAL

Eligibility: Interest & ability in the performing arts; letter of reference.

Two \$1,000 scholarships (\$500/semester for 1 year) will be awarded to East and/or West seniors who have shown an interest and ability in the performing arts (drama, music, dance, stage design, etc.). An adequate grade point average is necessary for each payment. **You must submit a letter of reference from the drama or music coach.**

WEST BEND MASONIC LODGE

ACADEMIC OR TECHNICAL

Eligibility: Academic achievement and community involvement and service.

The West Bend Masonic Lodge/Wentdorf Memorial is offering two \$2,000 scholarships (\$500 per year, renewable for four years) to a graduating senior at each high school. The intent of this award is to honor academic achievement and community involvement and service to a student who exhibits potential for future achievement, leadership, and success.



Dedicated to the development of academic-degree and vocational-technical scholarships, West Bend COLUMNS is a uniquely local program.

COLUMNS was created in 1972 when the West Bend Community High Schools Alumni Foundation (1962) and the West Bend Scholarship Fund (1965) merged to become W/B Community & Alumni Scholarship Foundation, Inc. Both organizations existed with the same purpose of providing financial aid to worthy West Bend High School students.

Funds are provided through the generosity of friends and alumni of the West Bend High Schools. COLUMNS offers scholarships from its own fund and it administers a number of awards sponsored by individuals, families and organizations in the community.

Awards are granted in both college (academic) and vocational / technical fields. Listed on the following pages are the scholarships either provided by or administered by or interviewed by COLUMNS. Each description provides a brief history of the scholarship as well as the eligibility qualifications. All students who apply for scholarships listed on the following pages will be interviewed by COLUMNS. The COLUMNS interview committee will determine which scholarships you are eligible for based on the information included in the application and further information offered during the interview. Since some scholarships are chosen based on school choice or career plans, note that if those plans change, the scholarship may be forfeited.

Be sure to fill out the application form carefully and completely and include any attachments that may be required (for example, letters of recommendations, essays, etc.) **Only one (1) application form needs to be filled out for all scholarships listed under COLUMNS. However, you must submit three (3) copies of that completed application in addition to the original, for a total of 4 applications just for COLUMNS.**

Applicants must have attended at least their last two years of education in the West Bend High Schools in order to be considered.

COLUMNS Technical Scholarships

DAN BECKER MEMORIAL

This scholarship is offered in memory of Dan Becker, a 1979 West Bend East graduate.

Type: Technical
School: East
Amount: \$500
Qualifications: Planning to attend a vocational / technical school
Financial need may be considered

The MARK and BETH BENSEN FAMILY

In appreciation of the West Bend School District, notably the teachers, coaches and staff you go the extra mile to impact student's lives.

Type: Technical
School: East or West
Amount: \$750 for one year
Qualifications: Top 50% of class
Strong consideration given to those with financial need and / or first-generation college or technical students.

WEST BEND COLUMNS

School: East and/or West
Amount: Several in varying dollar amounts
Qualifications: Pursuing a technical program of 9 month, one, two or three years
Financial need may be considered

RAY L ENGELKING MEMORIAL

Ray was an economics teacher at West Bend West and Moraine Park Technical School for decades. He was loved by his students because of the many stories he told them. He made economics understandable and applicable to their daily lives by teaching students how to be good consumers and always spent time with them so they could thrive. Ray always believed education was the key to giving all hard-working students a chance to succeed.

School: Preference given to West students attending Moraine Park Technical School
Annual Renewable Amount:
\$1,000 dollars per semester renewable for up to 6 semesters if student maintains 2.5 GPA
Qualifications: Financial need and community service or **teacher recommendation considered**
2.0 GPA in high school

The BYRAN HERTHER CULINARY ARTS

This scholarship is awarded to a student who is planning to work in the Food & Beverage industry.

Type: Technical
School: East or West
Amount: \$1,000 (\$1,000 to two students)
Qualifications: Student is planning to work in the Food & Beverage industry.

DANIEL D. KRUEPKE MEMORIAL

Daniel D. Kruepke was president of Kruepke Enterprises and had attended Milwaukee Area Technical College graduating in the field of diesel mechanics. Daniel's strong leadership qualities advanced not only his own position, but the company's as well.

Qualifications: Automotive / diesel mechanics or related field in transportation industry
Financial need considered
Class rank considered

DAVID MOSSMAN MEMORIAL

This scholarship was offered in memory of David Mossman, who was a teacher at McLane Elementary School.

School: East and/or West
Amount: 1 X \$1,500 or 2 X \$750
Qualifications: Financial need strongly considered
Seeking vocational training
Academic achievement in chosen field strongly considered

FRANK AND BETTY PLISCHOUNIG MEMORIAL

This scholarship was established in memory of Frank and Betty Plischounig, who operated Plischounig's retail store in West Bend from 1938 to 1966. Betty was the first woman to become a member of the West Bend Businessman's Association.

School: East or West
Amount: \$950
Qualifications: Planning to attend a vocational / technical college

WEST BEND SUNRISE ROTARY

Rotary is an international service organization with a worldwide membership of over 1 million people. Founded in Chicago in 1905 with the purpose of bringing together people of diverse backgrounds to exchange ideas regarding improving the lives of people in their communities and around the world. Rotary Motto: Service above Self.

Amount: 1 X \$1,000
Qualifications: School and community service strongly considered with first priority given to students active in Interact in their Junior and Senior years with at least 30 hours of Interact Volunteer Service Hours
Academic achievement in chosen field of study strongly considered
Must be attending school/training in Wisconsin
Financial need is strongly considered
Work related activities strongly considered
Letter of recommendation from teacher in area of study

SUDER-PICK TECHNICAL

The Suder-Pick Scholarships are awarded to students of the West Bend High Schools, giving due consideration to success in vocational or trade courses, extracurricular activities, community involvement and financial need, with preference to students who have a definite goal, profession or career as an objective for his or her higher education. It is the Suder-Pick Foundation's hope that West Bend High School seniors, aided by the scholarship program, will become productive and active citizens who will give back to their community through their talents and good works. The scholarship assistance must be used at an accredited vocational or trade school. This is a COLUMNS administered scholarship and the COLUMNS Interview Committee will interview students. A separate application is not required. Eight \$10,000 scholarships will be awarded to students pursuing a vocational or trade school education (\$2,500 per semester for two years). Students who wish to be considered for these scholarships should be pursuing a degree in the traditional trades such as: construction, plumbing, carpentry, electrical, and welding, just to name a few.

Type: Technical
School: East or West (4/school)
Amount: 8 x \$10,000 (\$2,500 per semester for 4 semesters) for students pursuing a vocational/trade school education
Qualifications: Preference to a student who has a definite goal
Consideration given to a student with achievement in trade courses, financial need, extracurricular activities, and community involvement
A student receiving the WI Technical Excellence Scholarship is not eligible

CURT STOCKHAUSEN AUTOMOTIVE TECHNICIAN

This scholarship was established by Curt Stockhausen to benefit students planning to pursue a career as an automotive technician.

This Scholarship was established by Curt Stockhausen to benefit students planning to pursue a career in the construction trades.

RICHARD N. BELL and MARJORIE (BELL) SCHELLINGER MEMORIAL

This scholarship was established in 2000 in memory of Richard Bell, who was a nationally recognized leader in real estate. Richard was co-founder, director and officer of Continental Properties Co., Inc. Marjorie (Bell) Schellinger was a 1973 graduate of West Bend East. She attended UWVC for two years graduating with an associate degree excelling in biology and then attended UW-Oshkosh for an additional year.

School: East or West

Amount: \$2,000

Qualifications: Upper 33% of class with plans to attend a Wisconsin technical school or a college in the U of WI System with emphasis on UW-Milwaukee at the Washington County campus.

Preference will be given to students pursuing business majors in real estate, commercial development, or finance. Preference will also be given to students who excel in biology, science, or math and have career intentions in the medical field or teaching these subjects.

Financial need strongly considered

Swim team participation strongly considered

Service to school and community will be considered

BIG CEDAR LAKE PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION

The Big Cedar Lake Property Owners Association is a non-profit corporation, established in 1949. The major objective of the association is to protect the lake and shoreline environment. The association is dedicated to the protection and preservation of this valuable natural resource, Big Cedar Lake. Established in 1999, this scholarship is in memory of Connie Dentzler, a life-long student, a musician and an artist. She dedicated a great deal of her time and boundless energy to supporting many worthwhile causes. Connie served her community through the boards of the West Bend Art Museum, United Way, COLUMNS, and as Rotary Club historian.

Amount: \$5,400 (\$1,350 per year)
Qualifications: Preference to student with a handicap or disability
Sincere desire in educational pursuits may be considered
Financial need may be considered

SILVIA AND EDWARD R. DROPPERS

Established in 1993, this scholarship is in honor of Silvia and Edward Droppers, who were West Bend residents and UW alums. Silvia was an English teacher and librarian. Edward served as vice president and loan officer of First Wisconsin Bank.

Type: Technical or Academic
School: One East and one West
Amount: To be determined in April of each year
Qualifications: Planning to attend UW-Milwaukee, UW-Madison or a vocational /technical college in Wisconsin
Major in physical science

DR. GREG GAMACHE MEMORIAL

Dr. Gamache loved sports. He had a heartfelt, selfless compassion and concern for helping others. This scholarship, established in 2006 by the friends of Greg Gamache, is intended to honor the "team player that stuck with it" even if that person did not start or play often.

Amount: 2 X \$500
Qualifications: Student athletes
Minimum GPA of 2.5
Outstanding character
Participation in at least one same sport for all four years of high school

WAYNE HEIDEL - JENNIFER SEMMANN FOUNDATION

This scholarship was established in memory of Wayne Heidel and his daughter, Jennifer Semmann. Wayne owned Heidel's Restaurant in Jackson beginning in 1969. Jennifer was a principal at MacArthur Elementary School in the Germantown School District and a very dedicated educator.

School: 2 - East and 2 - West
Amount: 4 x \$500
Qualifications: Planning to attend technical trade school or college
Dedicated to school athletics, school club membership and / or maintained a part-time job
3.0 GPA or better

CLARA B. JAEHNIG SOCIAL SERVICE

Clara Jaehnig gave a lifetime of community service. Most notably, she served as executive of the Red Cross in West Bend for 32 years, retiring in 1993.

School: East or West
Amount: \$500
Qualifications: Outstanding work in social service to school and community

LIZ (CLARK) JOHNSON MEMORIAL

This scholarship is offered in memory of Liz Johnson, a lifelong West Bend resident and a 1993 graduate of West Bend East High School.
