Attached are the requirements, instructions and application for the scholarships available through the American Legion within Washington County. This includes scholarships offered through the Washington County Council as well as those offered by any of the seven legion posts within Washington County. These scholarships will help several area students get a start at the educational institution of their choice.

The Washington County Council of the American Legion is comprised of members from the seven posts in our county – Allenton, Germantown, Hartford, Hubertus, Jackson, Kewaskum, and West Bend. All Washington County applications will be made available for all posts consideration.

The Washington County Scholarship is a one-time \$500 payment. The Washington County Council has set up this program to give out seven scholarships per year. The posts within the county may have additional scholarships available. Please contact the post within your area for more information.

The scholarships are open to any child or grandchild of a US Veteran as long as the student attends a high school within Washington County Wisconsin or is a homeschooled student who resides within Washington County Wisconsin.

Please promote and include these scholarships within the resources that are available through your program.

Applications are due from the students by February 12. We ask that the following copies be mailed to the American Legion by February 28.

WASHINGTON COUNTY COUNCIL AND WASHINGTON COUNTY LEGIONS POSTS SCHOLARSHIPS **STUDENT INSTRUCTIONS**

INTRODUCTION: The scholarships offered through the American Legion aim to provide graduates of Washington County High Schools and homeschoolers with additional funding for continuing education at a degree-granting college, university, or technical school within the United States. These scholarships are intended to assist students in obtaining a degree with some level of self-help.

AVAILABLE AWARDS: The Washington County Council offers several scholarships in the amount of \$500 each. In addition to these scholarships, local American Legion Posts may offer additional scholarships. The amount of these scholarships varies from post to post.

ELIGIBILITY: The applicant can qualify for a scholarship by meeting all the requirements listed below. Read all the requirements carefully, as applications will not be considered if these requirements are not fulfilled.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

1. Applicants must be either a son, daughter, or grandchild of a veteran of the United States Armed Forces, whether living or deceased.
2. Applicants must be a high school senior or equivalent, eligible to receive a diploma or its equivalent from their institution.
3. Applicants must have at least a 'C' average.
4. Applicants must attend a high school in Washington County, Wisconsin or homeschool students must reside in Washington County, Wisconsin.
5. Local American Legion Posts may require applicants to reside within a particular school district or nearby area.
6. The applicant must meet the entrance requirements of the chosen institution.
7. The applicant is required to submit the enclosed application along with the supporting documentation as specified within the application.

Within this application, you are applying for multiple American Legion Scholarships. **You must identify the local American Legion Post number on your application** to be considered for any scholarship offered through the local post.

DEADLINE: **Applications must be submitted by February 12 of the year of graduation,** or they will not be considered.

SUBMISSION INFORMATION: High school seniors should submit their completed application through their school Guidance Counselor, Scholarship Counselor or Career Readiness Center. Homeschool students should submit a completed application to both the Washington County Council of the American Legion and their local American Legion Post.
