Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2024-25 educational progress for the Williamston Middle School (WMS). The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2025-26 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student group in 2024-25. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had at least one student group performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, failed to exit CSI status in 2024-25, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no status label is given.

Our school was identified for: Has Not Been Given One of These Labels.

For the 2024-25 school year, WMS continued to focus on quality instruction and offered Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) to meet the needs of all learners. Through intentional instructional design and focusing on learners' needs, we were able to demonstrate academic growth and achievement through local, state, and national assessments. The collaboration between staff, students, families, and the community has proven to support students and their growth.

State law requires that we also report additional information:

1. Williamston Middle School enrolls or assigns students who live in the district and also offers open enrollment for students who live outside of Williamston Community Schools.
2. WMS is a public school that serves students in grades 6-8.

6. The percentage of students represented by parents at parent-teacher conferences:

Fall 2025

6th grade = 60%, 7th grade = 56%, 8th grade = 40%

Spring 2025

6th grade = 42%, 7th grade = 40%, 8th grade = 30%

Fall 2024

6th grade = 61%, 7th grade = 54%, 8th grade = 39%
