School Information

EMC @ GTCC-J is a cooperative innovative magnet high school, offering an accelerated program providing the opportunity for students to access college courses and graduate with an Associate degree or college credential. The high school schedule is on a 4-block semester. To graduate, students must meet the state of NC graduation requirements and local course requirements. Our host college is Guilford Technical Community College (GTCC) and we are located on the Jamestown Campus. Class Rank

Class of 2025 Distinctions

The class of 2025 had 62 graduates. Of the 62, 30 graduated with a NC high school diploma and numerous transferable college credits. The remaining 32 graduates graduated with not only their NC high school diploma, but also an Associate Degree that will transfer to all UNC system schools, per the CAA. Of the 32 college graduates, 5% of the 2025 graduates earned both an Associate's Degree and an additional college credential. Of the 62 graduates, 10 earned their Service Learning Diploma (documented 250+ hours of service learning) and 9 earned the distinction of being an NC Academic Scholar. The class of 2025 earned over 2.2 million dollars in scholarship money.
