What is it? A Climate Reality chapter is a local, community-based group of activists who organize to take climate action, educate the public, and advocate for change. These chapters, allow members to network, develop action plans to advance clean energy, influence local policy, and engage their communities on climate issues.

Community and Campus Groups: Chapters are spaces for people of all backgrounds to come together and work on climate solutions in their specific area.

Key Activities: Chapters engage in various activities, such as legislative efforts (like lobbying and letter-writing campaigns), community events (like presentations and workshops), and public campaigns to raise awareness and support for climate policies.

Support for Activists: They provide a platform for members to collaborate, drawing on the broader support and resources of The Climate Reality Project to execute local action plans.

Goals: A primary goal is to encourage local businesses to become more sustainable, and to push city and state leaders to cut emissions and adopt clean energy solutions.
