NDCR and the Cristo Rey Education Model

Notre Dame Cristo Rey High School (NDCR), sponsored by the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur opened in 2004. NDCR is a member of the National Cristo Rey Model of high schools in the country that integrates four years of rigorous, college preparatory academics with 4 years of professional work experience through the innovative Corporate Work Study Program (CWSP)

NDCR partners with 70 local businesses and organizations where student work in entry-level positions one full day a week (five full days a month) earning part of their own education costs. Students are evaluated quarterly by their own work supervisors receiving both a grade and academic credit for their CWSP participation.

NDCR is a Catholic, affordable, career focused, college preparatory experience that delivers a powerful and innovative approach to education that equips students from families of limited economic means with knowledge, character, and skills to achieve their aspirations and goals.

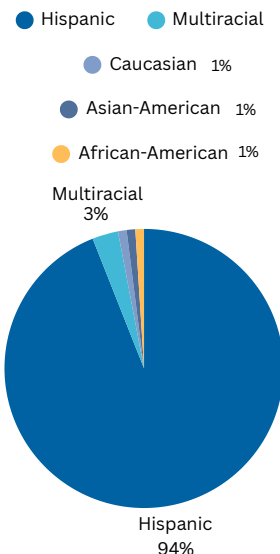

*Integrated Math is a re-imagined way of teaching mathematics that integrates traditional Algebra, Geometry, Trigonometry, Precalculus, and Statistics topics throughout an organic sequence of courses allowing students to bridge connections between topics in the moment not only through a mathematical lens, but also in the scope of real-world applications. Each year the concepts that students learn build off one another to help improve retention and provide students the opportunity to dive deeper into the critical math concepts that are foundational to their learning.
