- Mr. Poole shared with the council how he reassesses. He follows Bulloch County Policy. They give common assessments across the grade level. They also work together to flex group students to enrich, remediate, and accelerate.
- Mrs. Oglesby asked Mr. Poole to share how he remediates with direct instruction. She encourages teachers to remediate using a different approach.
