What is Academic Probation?

Academic Probation is a temporary status assigned to FAVE students who fail 3 or more courses in a given quarter of the school year.

Students on academic probation receive communication via email from the administration team and include a list of supports and are monitored throughout the next quarter of instruction with the goal of obtaining satisfactory academic standing (passing all classes). There will be check-in communication at the 4.5-week interval.

Additional Requirements:

- Students on Academic Probation may also be required to report in person on specific days to receive additional support.
- Students on Academic Probation will be required to check in weekly with an assigned staff member.

Student/Parent Supports:

- Canvas Parent Observer Account
- Check & Connect with a FAVE teacher
- Extended Learning
- Wednesday Support Sessions with Teachers
- Parent involvement in organization to tackle missing assignments, engage in class, and attend daily.

How do students get on Academic Probation?

Data reports are pulled at the 4.5-week grading periods to identify students who are not meeting the expected standards below.

- Failing 3 or more courses
- Chronic absenteeism
- Out of compliance Behavior with the district's Student Code of Conduct

How do students get off Academic Probation?

Students may earn their way off of Academic Probation by earning passing grades or showing significant improvement in academic performance. Students must also show satisfactory attendance

during the probationary period.

What happens if a student doesn't make progress?

Unfortunately, virtual learning isn't for everyone. Students who continue to fail 3+ courses and/or have chronic absenteeism will be administratively withdrawn at the end of the grading period and required to return to in-person learning.
