

The St. Bernard Parish Public School System believes in developing the whole child, offering students of all ages the opportunity to participate in athletics and the arts.


- All second grade students have the opportunity to learn swimming and water safety at Chalmette High School's Olympic swimming facility.

Newly constructed and renovated following Hurricane Katrina, our school system has 12 state-of-the-art schools.

- Chalmette High School's athletic facilities rival many university campuses and offer student athletes football, baseball and softball fields and field houses, batting facilities, an Olympic swimming pool, wrestling facilities, two fitness centers, three gymnasiums, and indoor and outdoor running tracks.
- Chalmette High School's Cultural Arts facility features a 420 seat theater, a technology theater, two dance studios, a chorus room, a music lab and four practice rooms, a recording studio, and a costume shop.
- The Maumus Center includes a planetarium, a 125-seat auditorium, a professional teaching kitchen, and gallery equipped spaces.


