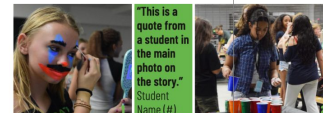
"My favorite thing to go with my hot dogs is Cheetos because of the way they crunch and how they taste in my mouth," Dylan Knott (8) said.

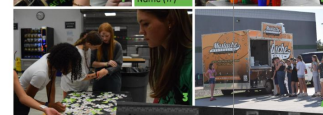
