 - 4 each semester = 8 per year = 32 possible credits
 - Students will be retained during HS years
 - Must complete Career Portfolio
 - Various artifacts for 9th - 11th grades
 - 3 artifacts each year - School Links

Additional Information

- Depending on math placement/sequence, most 9th grade students take 2 math courses (Alg 1A Fall, Alg 1B Spring), some will only have one math
- 9th grade honors level science students will take Biology
 - will have taken Advanced General Science in MS
 - Chemistry will be in 10th grade
- Online classes are available, but not recommended for 9th graders
- Teacher Recommendations
 - Prior to the override form, discuss with classroom teacher and school counselor
 - Schedule made based on requests
 - If you override a teacher course recommendation, student will remain in the course



Additional Information

- Summer School for Incoming 9th Graders (Class of 2030)
 - **H8941: FCS (Family Consumer Science .5 credit)**
 - Class runs June 15 - July 26
 - Must attend first class in-person and pick-up/drop-off Real Care Baby
 - **H0711: Lifetime Fitness I (.5 credit, meets grade 9 PE credit)**
 - Class runs June 15 - July 26

***Advanced credit courses = @275.00 each, must be in-person on 6/15/26

- Comm Tech
 - Runs every other summer, NOT Summer 2026

Taking a summer school class does not guarantee enrollment in desired/specific course for the school year.
