Dear Parents and Guardians,

We would like to take a moment to explain what a Flexible Instructional Day is and what it means for your child.

A **Flexible Instructional Day (FID)** is used when school buildings must be closed (for example, due to weather or other emergencies), but instruction can still continue remotely. On these days, students do not report to school in person but are expected to complete instructional activities at home.

On a Flexible Instructional Day:

- Teachers will provide instructional activities such as packets, online assignments (including IXL), or other appropriate learning tasks.
- Students are expected to complete the assignments provided by their teachers.
- Teachers will be available to support students during designated office hours using Microsoft Teams:
 1. **10:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m.**
 2. **1:00 p.m. – 2:00 p.m.**

Students and families may use these office hours to ask questions, receive clarification, or get help with assignments.

Attendance on a Flexible Instructional Day is based on the completion of the assignments provided. Students who complete and submit their work will be marked present for the day.

We appreciate your partnership and support in helping your child continue learning, even when we are unable to be together in the school building. If you have questions or need assistance, please feel free to reach out to your child's teacher or the school office.
