## ADVANCED PLACEMENT

### High School Grades

Recommended that students have earned an "A" or "B" in a college prep. level class within the same subject.

### College Board

High school courses that follow a nationally standardized curriculum provided by College Board.

### College/University Policy

College credit is not guaranteed and depends on the student's exam score and the policies of the college they plan to attend.

### Fee

Families pay the cost for the exam. The cost varies from year to year but is typically around \$100.

### College Board

Students register for the AP exam in the fall and make a deposit. The final payment is due in February.

## DUAL ENROLLMENT

### SAT Scores/Grades

Determined by the college/university. This can include SAT scores and/or grades in previous courses.

### College/University

Provided by the college/university.

### Transfer Options

College credit is awarded based on the successful completion of the course. Transfer of credit to a different college depends on that school's policy.

### Free

Currently, SHS pays tuition and fees associated with the courses. No fee for students.

### College/University

Dual enrollment college application.
