CREDIT ATTAINMENT

Farber & DeWolf Credit Attainment

Grades served: 10-12

Credit attainment is designed to support credit acceleration for students who are at risk of not graduating in their requirement year. Students must be at least 16 years of age and 30+ credits deficient to be eligible. *Grades served: High School*

ONLINE LEARNING

Farber Online

Grades served: 1-12

Virtual instruction for students for grades 1-12. Live instruction is delivered virtually through TEAMS. The instructional minutes are the same as "in-person" school and students must attend their scheduled classes daily.

INDEPENDENT STUDY

Farber Independent Study

Grades served: 10-12

Independent Study (IS) is an optional alternative instructional strategy for eligible students whose health/personal circumstances make classroom attendance difficult and/or who need to make up credits to fill gaps in their learning.

Long-Term IS is available at Farber Campus only.

School Site Short Term Independent Study

Grades served: K-12

Short-Term Independent Study (1-15 school days per academic year) is available at each school site by submitting an ERC referral.

COMMUNITY DAY

Phoenix Elementary

Grades served: K-6

Phoenix Secondary

Grades served: 7-12

Community Day schools are for students who have either been expelled or are considered high-risk due to behavior and attendance issues. School programs focus on the development of pro-social skills, student self-esteem, and resiliency.

HOME HOSPITAL INSTRUCTION

Home Hospital Instruction

Grades served: K-12

Home Hospital Instruction (HHI) provides instruction to students who incur a temporary disability, which makes attendance in the regular day classes or alternative education program impossible or inadvisable.

Fulton

Grades served: 9-12

A school designed to meet the Social and Emotional needs of students. Need is determined by an Individual Education Plan (IEP) Team prior to enrollment.

ADULT EDUCATION

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Fresno Adult School

Age served: 18+ Non-grad

Adult services include: High School Diploma/Equivalency Exams, Career Technical training, enrichment classes, Naturalization and Basic Skills.

Adult Transition Program

Age served: 18-22 Non-grad

Adults 18-22 years old with an IEP who did not graduate from high school are also supported through Life Skills classes and Work Experience connections through the Adult Transition Program.
