CHARACTERISTICS

- Saint Mary's Hall was founded in 1879 on the principles of knowledge, self-confidence, and respect for others.
- The school is an independent, coeducational day school for students of all faiths serving prekindergarten through seniors in high school.

- 100% of our students attend college.
- 26.4% of our students receive financial aid.

ACADEMIC OVERVIEW

- Saint Mary's Hall does not rank.
- Students are expected to carry a minimum of 5 academic subjects each year.
- **AP classes and College Level classes receive an additional 1.0 weight. Honors classes receive an additional .5 weight into the GPA.**
- **GPA represents only work completed at Saint Mary's Hall.**
- Students enroll in Honors, AP, and College Level classes based on faculty recommendations.
- 9th graders are not eligible for AP and College Level classes.
- 10th graders may be eligible to take select select AP courses.
- Students enrolled in AP classes are not required to take the AP exam.

SIGNATURE PROGRAMS

Research Science Scholars: The Research Science Scholars program is a selective opportunity designed to equip students to engage in a real lab space in an informed and proactive way. Selected students partner with Saint Mary's Hall science instructors to discuss, practice, and experience lab techniques, etiquette, and applications in preparation for official internships in labs in various scientific fields. Students engage in their internship for the duration of the academic year.

School Year Abroad (SYA): SYA is a cultural immersion program that allows high school students the opportunity to study in Europe or Asia for a semester or academic year. Saint Mary's Hall is one of 40 independent schools across the United States and parts of Europe that are part of the SYA consortium. SYA grades are not included in the GPA reported by Saint Mary's Hall.

Student Experience: Student Experience wellness electives speak directly to the Saint Mary's Hall motto, Find Delight in Simple Things. This unique and innovative program cultivates enhanced opportunities for real-world engagement, cooperative understanding, leadership application, interdisciplinary exploration, personal fulfillment, and creative expression.

Global Seal of Biliteracy: The Global Seal of Biliteracy showcases our students' language skills in a universally consistent credential.

Arts Mentorship Program (AMP): The AMP provides mentorship and real-world experience for fine arts students with an interest in arts management. Selected students work in a learning capacity at a local art museum or gallery and present a culminating capstone project.

Health and Wellness Block: The SMH Wellness Program seeks to help each student develop the mindset and skills needed to live a healthy life, now and in the future. At every grade level, students are taught how to care for their bodies and social-emotional skills that promote positive mental health.

Global Education: The Office of Global Education & Experiential Learning prepares graduates to thrive, work, and learn globally, ensuring they are more than academically prepared; they possess the knowledge, skills, and dispositions to be world ready. We cultivate global competencies through a variety of curricular and co-curricular programs focused on three dimensions of learning: knowing oneself, knowing others, and knowing the world. Through field experiences, cultural exchanges, camping excursions, internships, international study, and innovative curriculum design, students transfer their learning to real-world contexts, develop critical self-awareness, and appreciate diverse perspectives so they can take meaningful action on local and global issues. Financial aid allows all students to participate.
