

In middle school, students have the ability to accelerate their math studies. Students take a placement test and initial placements are made for their 6th grade year. With teacher input, family conversations, and student performance, placements can and do change over their middle school career. For example, a student may start in single accelerated 6th grade math, work over the summer to complete standards in 7th and 8th grade, and then test into double accelerated for 7th grade.
