CURRICULAR TOOLS AND RESOURCES IN 2025-2026

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- Adopted **Dibels 8th edition Literacy Screener** and partnered with Amplify for online platform and professional development for all staff K-3.
- Expanded access to **My Reading Academy** for grades 4 and 5
- Adopted **new instructional series for English Language Arts** grades 6-8 with Study Sync (McGraw Hill)
- Expanded the **Sayreville District Writing Assessment** to grades 3-11 and added a post test.
- Partnered with **Imagine Learning's Edgenuity** platform to provide online credit recovery for identified students at SMS.
- Adopted ***SuccessMaker for Envision and Momentum***, a math proficiency screener to help meet needs of our students in mathematics.
- Initiated a **math program exploration** committee, previewed multiple programs and identified a program to pilot in Spring of 2026.
- Revised over **70 curriculum guides** in all content areas, grades K-12.
- Developed and implemented a grant funded **Climate Change program at SUES** and maintained our SMS initiative through local funding.


Expanded Opportunities for Sayreville Public Schools Students for 2025-2026

- Provide extended school year for students PK-12 through Learning Acceleration, Camp XL, SMS Credit Recovery, and AP Bootcamp funded through Federal Grant Money and locally
- Expanded dual enrollment course offerings to move closer to our goal of providing students opportunity to earn an associate degree in general liberal arts upon graduation through Middlesex through the addition of two more required courses as well as add more approved staff.
- Local funding for extracurricular activities related to multiple content areas such as DECA, FBLA, Odyssey of the Mind, Technology Student Association, ECOS, HOSA and more
- Provided students with Tier 2 support in ELA, Math and Science through Learning Academies in grades K-11
- Funded transportation as well as other costs related to over 200 field trips.

2026-2027 Curriculum and Instructional Proposed New Expenses

- Curriculum and Instructional Tools

- Purchase mathematics core program materials, digital licensing and fund PD for staff grades K-8, Algebra I, Algebra II and Geometry
- Purchase ESL new core instructional materials for students in Grades K-12
- Purchase World Language textbook series and digital licensing for Spanish I, II, III, and IV at SWMHS
- Classroom instructional supplies for all courses such as journals, whiteboards, anchor chart paper, as well as program specific supplies for mathematics manipulatives, science lab materials, materials for Foods, Auto and Wood Shop.
- F& P, Heggerty materials, novels and supplemental texts for LAL in grades 4-12 as needed as well as consumable workbooks for students.
- Annual Licensing for online resources related to text series such as StudySync, History, Business. Science
- Annual licensing for online tools such as ST Math, MyReading/MyMath, Achieve 3000, Silas (SEL), Belouga, Discovery Education, Amplify, Heggerty, etc.
- Replacement physical textbooks due to attrition and enrollment for all subjects
- Vendor contract (Proximity) for remote teaching of ASL grade 3 and at SWMHS
- Continue the revision of existing curriculum guides and development of new guides as needed for NJDOE Compliance and to ensure effective instruction in all content areas.

2026-2027 Curriculum and Instructional Proposed New Expenses

Opportunities for Students:

- Continue to fund transportation for field trips to enhance learning
- Continue to fund before school, after school academies to support students academically as well as Tier 3 services when needed for identified students.
- Continue to fund activities related to Climate Change Exploration post grant in grades 4-8
- Continue to fund AP exam fees for all students enrolled in SWMHS courses
- Continue to fund online courses SWMHS students to expand our offerings
- Expand American Sign Language at SWMHS to include ASL III
- Expand Unified electives course offerings at the high school level
- Continue to provide access for all students in grade 6-12 to On Demand Tutoring
- Expand student exposure to College and Career Readiness through sessions with a counselor
