WHEREAS, Sustainability means using resources wisely, saving money and reducing our impact on the environment, all of which will ensure the future health, safety, and prosperity of our children; and;

WHEREAS, The Rockaway Borough Board of Education Board of seeks to support and work with school staff and administrators, students and parents to ensure a safe and healthy environment for students by encouraging our school community to implement sustainable, energy-smart, eco-friendly and cost-effective solutions.

WHEREAS, Rockaway Borough Board of Education is participating in the Sustainable Jersey for Schools Program; and

WHEREAS, one of the purposes of the Sustainable Jersey for Schools Program is to provide resources to school districts to make progress on sustainability issues, and they have created a grant program called the Sustainable Jersey for Schools Small Grants Program;

THEREFORE, the Rockaway Borough Board of Education has determined that Rockaway Borough School District should apply for the aforementioned grant program, in the amount of \$10,000. The grant will be used as an initiative to transform underutilized outdoor areas within the Rockaway Borough School District into climate-resilient, sustainable learning environments. These outdoor zones will provide students with safe, shaded, and environmentally responsible spaces for instruction, wellness, and hands-on environmental learning while strengthening the district’s commitment to sustainability, climate preparedness, and student well-being.

The project will establish two functional outdoor learning zones that incorporate green infrastructure, native landscaping, and stormwater management features. These spaces will serve as both instructional settings and living laboratories, modeling best practices that can be replicated across additional district sites in future phases.

The proposed improvements extend beyond routine operational funding and align directly with the goals and expectations of the Sustainable Jersey for Schools grant program by advancing environmental stewardship, climate resilience, and community engagement.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that of the Rockaway Borough Board of Education, State of New Jersey, authorize the submission of the aforementioned. Sustainable Jersey for Schools Grant.
