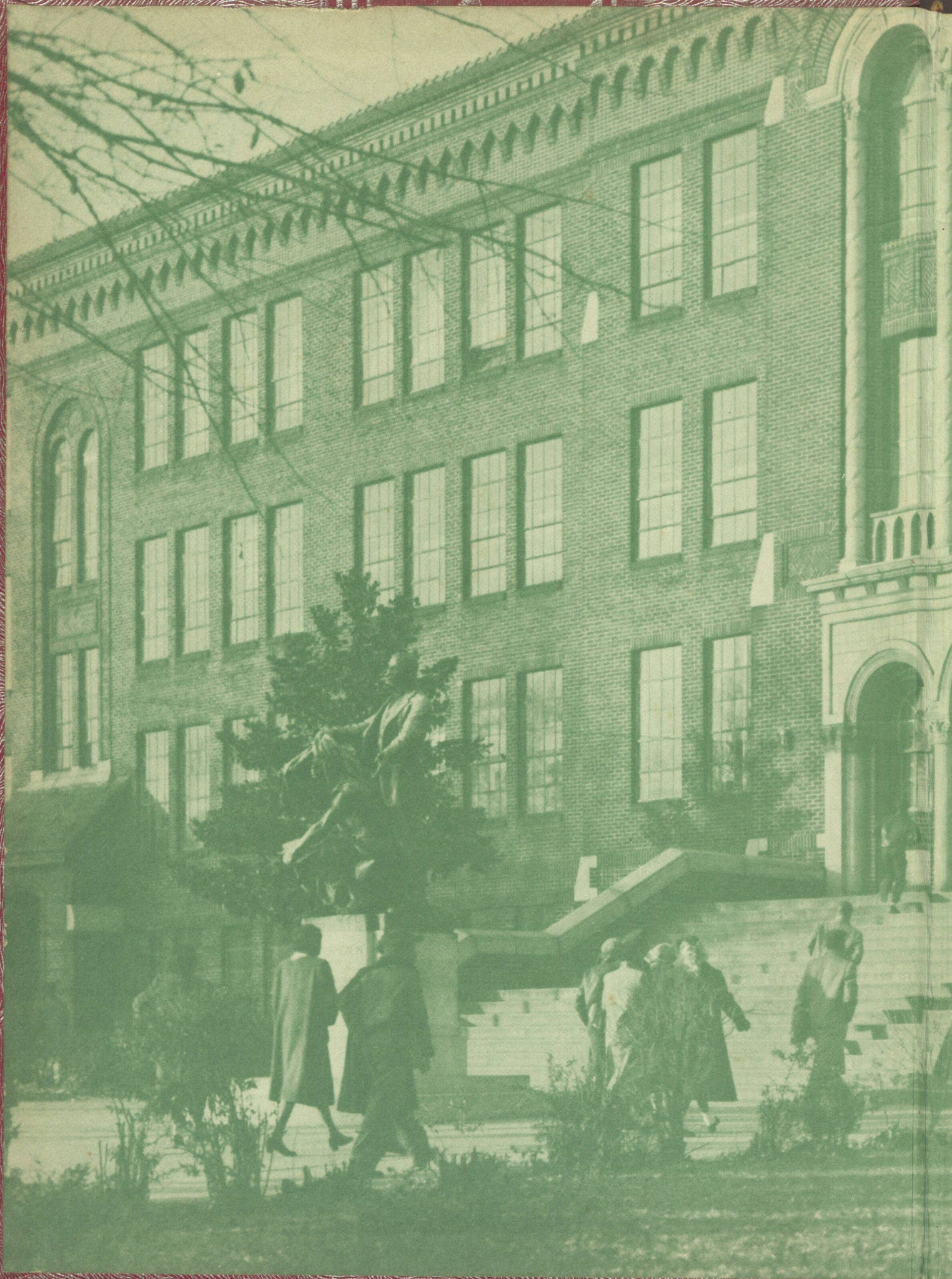


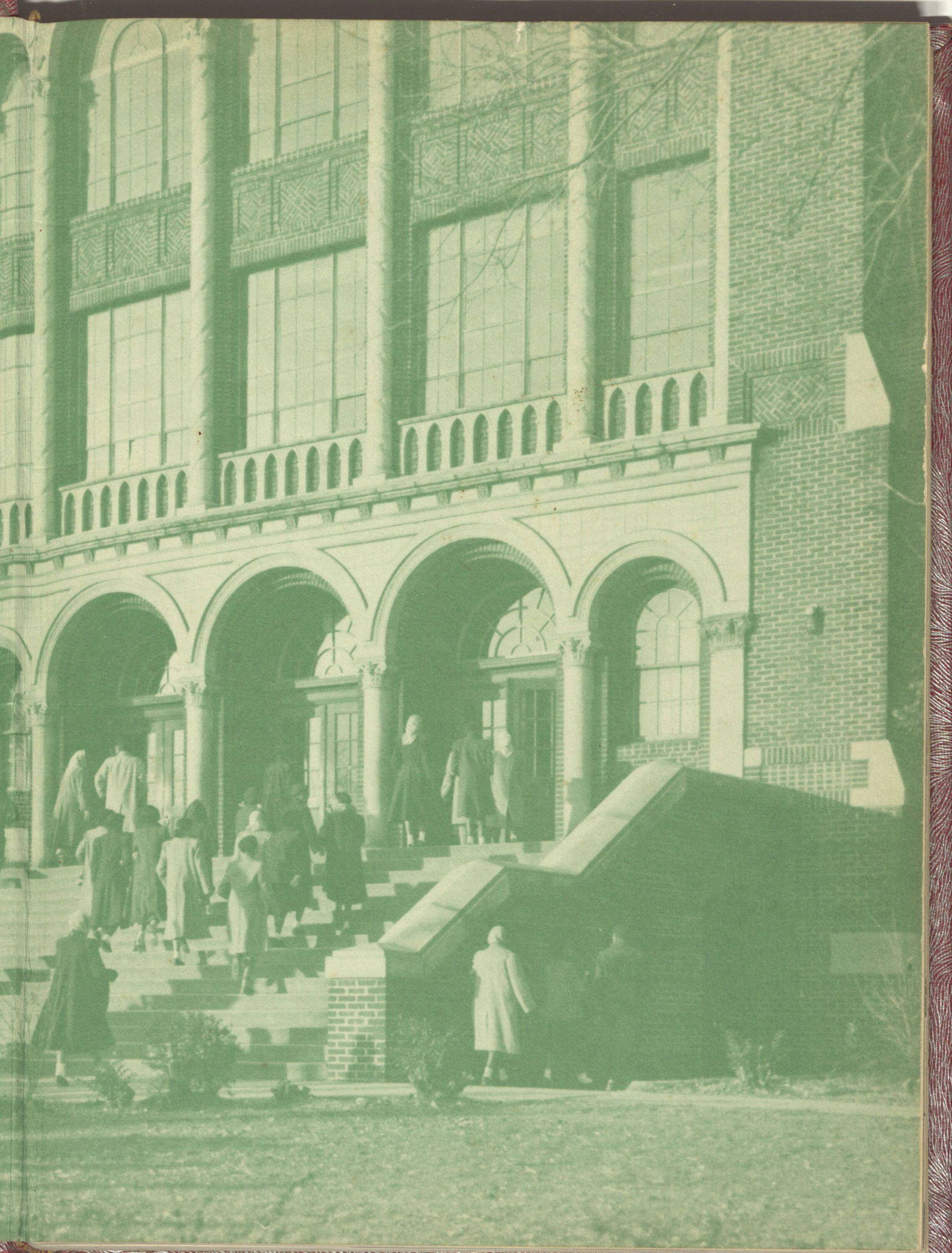

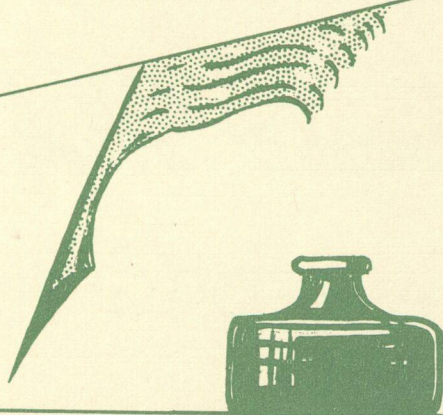




Foreword

The boys track team of W. H. S. won the city and state championships and also won five relays at the Tuskegee relays. They placed first and second in the special 100 yards run.

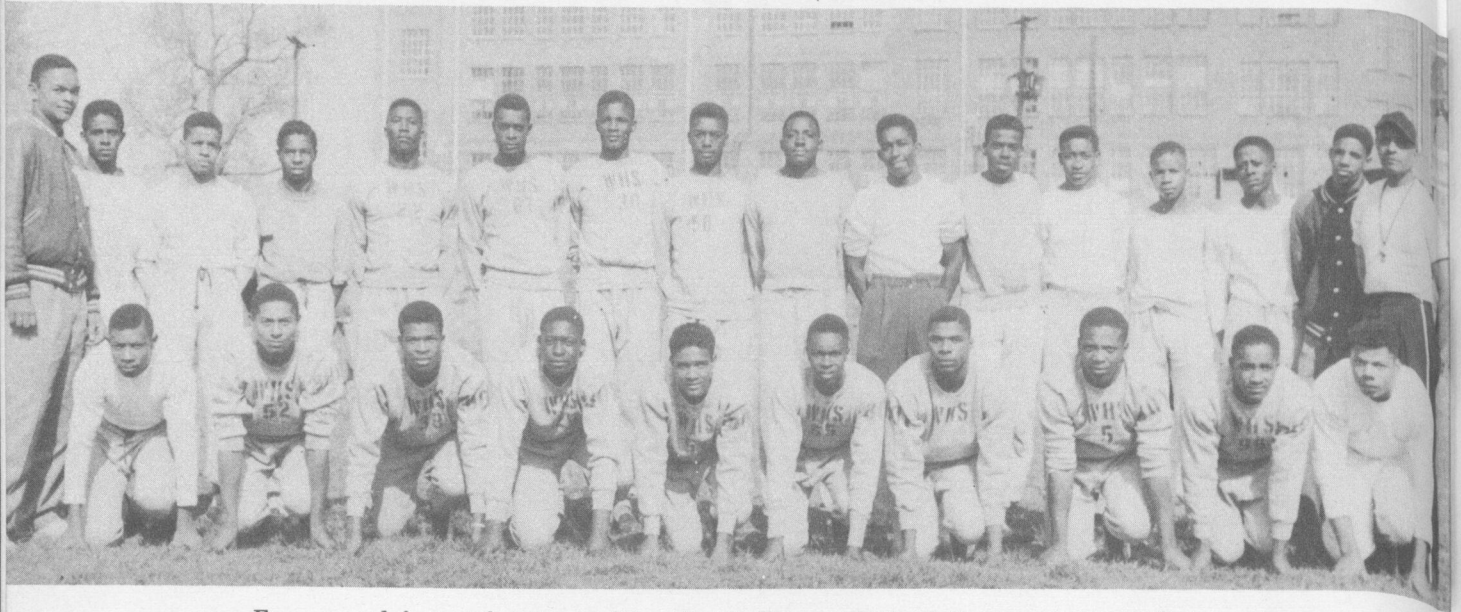
The Washington high girls won the city track championship, placed second in the state meet, and won the Tuskegee high school girls track and field meet.
