ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) COMMITMENT



SEAHOLM HIGH SCHOOL ADVANCED PLACEMENT COMMITMENT – 2026-2027

Advanced Placement (AP) courses are designed to be taught at a college level in order to prepare students for the AP test. This requires students to demonstrate a high level of personal responsibility (and organize their time wisely) as they accomplish classroom tasks, and complete projects and reading outside of class. AP courses move at a faster pace and require a significant time commitment; the decision to take an AP course should not be taken lightly. Consider the rigor of your entire schedule, school activities, and other time commitments throughout the year when contemplating whether to take one or more AP classes.

I understand that I am committed to my decision for 2026--2027 school year. I also understand that I must complete the summer reading and assignments, take ownership of my own learning, participate in class routinely, and ask questions regularly. I understand a student enrolled in an AP or honors course may not drop the course unless the following conditions exist:

- a grade of a D or E at the end of the semester
- completion of a parent communication during each grading period
- demonstration of the student seeking consistent academic assistance
- and space available in comparable courses.

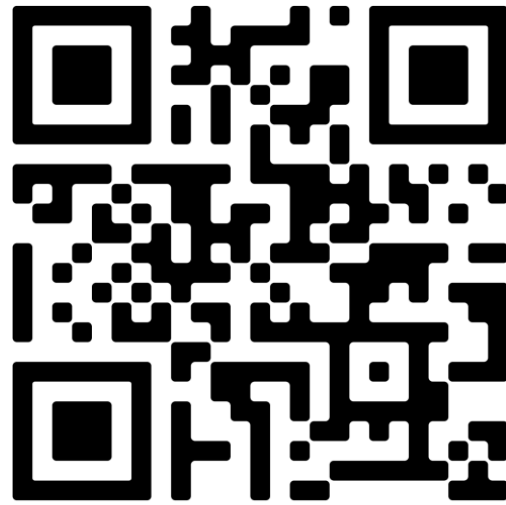

SCHEDULING FAQS

1. Do I need to meet before the meet? 😊

ANSWER: There is no need to meet prior to your scheduling meeting. These scheduling meetings are 70-80 minutes long; there is plenty of time for discussion and revising course choices if necessary. However, if you feel like you have many questions or this is stressful, then schedule a meeting to see us prior to your scheduling meeting.

2. Can I make changes to my courses after I enter them in PowerSchool?

ANSWER: Yes, this may be done during your scheduling meeting.

3. Do I need my laptop for my scheduling meeting?

ANSWER: **Yes**

4. What if I cannot attend my scheduling meeting?

ANSWER: Please attend another one of your counselor's scheduling sessions.


