



Kingsway Regional High School Named to College Board's AP School Honor Roll

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
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Woolwich Twp. – Kingsway Regional High School has been named to the **College Board's Advanced Placement® (AP®) School Honor Roll** for the **2024–2025 school year**, earning **Bronze-level distinction**. The AP School Honor Roll recognizes schools whose AP programs are delivering strong results for students while expanding access to rigorous, college-level coursework.

Schools earn this recognition annually based on criteria that reflect a commitment to building a strong college-going culture, increasing opportunities for students to earn college credit, and supporting college readiness. Kingsway's Bronze designation reflects continued efforts to broaden participation in AP coursework while maintaining high academic expectations.

This recognition builds upon Kingsway’s continued success and long-standing commitment to Advanced Placement access and achievement. During the 2024–2025 school year, Kingsway was also recognized for its intentional expansion of AP course offerings, resulting in a 37% increase in student enrollment in AP coursework. In addition, 85 Kingsway students earned prestigious academic honors through the College Board National Recognition Programs, reflecting exceptional academic dedication and achievement. These programs highlight high-performing students, particularly those from rural areas and Black, Indigenous, and Latino backgrounds, and connect them with colleges and scholarship opportunities seeking diverse talent. Kingsway has also been named to the AP School Honor Roll in prior years and ranked among the best high schools in South Jersey by *U.S. News & World Report* on multiple occasions.
