MAP GROWTH ASSESSMENT

Elementary students have participated in the second opportunity of the MAP Growth assessment. This checkpoint allows teachers to understand how much academic progress students have made since the beginning of the year and to adjust instruction accordingly.

MAP Growth is not a pass/fail test. Instead, it is designed to measure learning over time, helping teachers tailor instruction to students' needs and helping students recognize their own growth and progress.

How Families Can Support Learning

- Focus on effort and growth: Celebrate persistence, improvement, and positive learning habits rather than perfection.
- Have reflective conversations: Ask questions such as, "What have you learned that feels easier now?" or "What is something you want to keep improving this year?"
- Support learning routines at home: Regular reading, math conversations, and consistent routines help reinforce learning and confidence.
